Report of the Librarian

To THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE
LAWRENCE FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY:

Herewith is respectfully submitted my report of the work of the Lawrence Free Public Library during its tenth fiscal year ending December 31st, 1914.

That the year 1914 has been one of the most active in the history of the library, is a source of gratification. The fact that the circulation has increased only 88 over that of 1913 does not seem to indicate this, but a glance at the shifting of the circulation from fiction to non-fiction will prove the point. The fiction circulation which, in a measure is the mere charging and discharging of the books, has decreased 1101, while the non-fiction which requires for selection in most cases, the undivided attention of the attendant for varied lengths of time, has increased 1189.

The largest monthly circulation was in January, a total of 5,427, 4,206 adult and 1221 juvenile. The largest day was February 7th, a total of 379, 318 adult and 61 juvenile.

The smallest month was June, a total of 2,690, 2,052 adult and 638 juvenile. The smallest day was June 10th, commencement day, a total of 82, 55 adult and 27 juvenile.

The registration cards now number 4,202, an addition of 1,603 during the year, an average of 133 cards a month. As each patron is allowed all the non-fiction desired, this means that probably 200 cards are issued in a month to the 133 cards registered.

The accessions for the year were 1,138, 1,026 by purchase and 112 by gift. Of those purchased, 42 were from the Perkins Memorial fund. In October, 1907 the bequest of \$1,000.00 from the L. H. Perkins estate was invested in interest bearing securities, and since that time 275 of the most valuable books in the library have been purchased from this income.

There have been 730 vols. re-bound and 72 vols. of current periodicals bound, 492 more than last year. The delayed binding of 1913 was brought over into 1914, thus accounting for the unusually large number.

The story hour which has been an important factor in introducing the children to the juvenile department has not been resumed this year. Miss Edwards, who has charge of the children's department has given much time and attention to the selection of books helpful to the teachers in the school room story hour. This with graded lists ready for their inspection and the books ready for their use minimizes the necessity for the library story hour. And while we shall be glad to resume this feature of the library work at no distant day, it has seemed possible to omit it this year without much loss to either library or children.

There seems to be no way of checking up the reference work of a library, though this branch is the farthest reaching in its effects of any work accomplished. The children in the grades, High School and K. U. students, club members and members of no clubs, men and women both, come to the library as the general information bureau on any and all subjects, and a very few go away unsatisfied.

The first week in December talks on library matters to the freshmen and sophomores of the High School were given by the librarians. These talks have been given each fall to the freshmen only but owing to the pressure of other work were omitted last year. This year the sophomores were included that there might be no break in this branch of their education. The young people were brought by classes to the library and given instruction from deportment on entering the library through various phases of the work with which they come in contact, up to the use of the catalog and the periodical index. This always is time well spent, as it is helpful to both students and librarians.

The growth of the library seems slow but when we consider that again the book shelf question confronts us, we realize a healthy development has been in progress. The purchase of books in any quantity must be delayed until suitable extension is made.

It is with the greatest pleasure that the librarian acknowledges the hearty co-operation of the Library Board. To this is due the fact that the work of an unusually active year has been accomplished with order and dispatch.
