RURAL SCHOOL GRADUATES OF 1913

Rural School Graduates will hold exercises in Lawrence on June 14, 1913. Girls outnumber boys. Nellie GRIGSBY, of Lawrence and Vena SPIGLE of Overbrook received highest grades in examinations.

Ninety-nine rural school students of Douglas County passed the examinations for the completion of the school course and will receive their diplomas at the graduating exercises to be held in the Lawrence high school building in the afternoon of June 14.

There is almost double the number of girls that there is of boys, the girl graduates numbering sixty-one and the boys thirty-eight.

County Superintendent HAWLEY, has sent out invitations to the graduating exercises over the county. The program has not yet been arranged but the superintendent contemplates inviting a speaker to address the graduates rather than having a program made up of numbers given by the graduates themselves.

Died, at the poor farm, on Sunday evening, January 15, at 6 o'clock, Mr. Henry VAUSBAUGH. He was taken there from Willow Springs township, June 26. He was born in New York, and was thirty years of age. Mr. VAUSBAUGH had the secret of some great crime which he wanted to reveal, but he wanted to tell it with his last breath. He sent for the superintendent several times, but kept putting it off until he could not speak. This secret, if it had been revealed, might have been the means of releasing some poor prisoner of an imputation which he was or is doomed to bear, or which possibly had consigned some innocent person to a premature and dishonored end.

His funeral will take place to-day and his remains will be taken to Oak Hill cemetery.

This church, in Lecompton, Kansas was organized in 1857. The church building was completed in 1858. Rev. William Wilson was the first minister and was succeeded in 1872 by Rev. Irwin. The church was sold in 1881 to be used as a private residence.

The Dodder and Simmons Family
of Marion Township

In 1957, Zoe Dentler Thompson Brant wrote a historical novel (based on fact) about her ancestors, the Dodder, Simmons and Thompson families of Marion township, Douglas County, Kansas. The book is called, The Hill or Simmons Point.¹

She explains in the book that the Didders and Simmons were some of the earliest settlers in Marion township. In fact, Peter Dodder² and three friends, George Shobert, James Baker and Samuel Hayes were the first white men to stake their claim at Lapeer in 1855.

Lapeer, now extinct, was situated near the headwaters of Rock Creek and was named for a town of the same name in Michigan. Peter Dodder built his shanty on an old road which ran north of the Old Santa Fe Trail. Nearby, in 1856, the Butterfield Stage Coach company was established. Enterprising Peter Dodder recognized the need for an "eating house." So, he and his daughter, Elmira Dodder Simmons began selling coffee and flap-jacks from his shanty and were soon doing a profitable business.


Before Elmira Dodder arrived in Kansas to be with her father, she had married Phillip Simmons in Michigan.

Phillip Simmons, son of John Simmons, was one of four children born to his parents. After Phillip's father died, his mother married a Mr. Roy and they came to Kansas. In 1858, Phillip Simmons filed a claim in Osage County, Kansas, but soon after sold this claim and went north to Canada and Michigan, where he met his bride-to-be. After the Civil War, the couple settled in a house in Marion township at a place called, The Hill or Simmons Point.

This interesting novel spans the period from the territorial years to the 1950's. Some of the other families mentioned in the book are the Badsky, Baldwin, Deming and Roy families. A copy of this book may be seen at Watkins Community Museum in Lawrence, Kansas.

MODEL DISTRICT NO. 83

When District No. 83 was being organized it was found that there was not enough valuation within its proposed boundaries to yield sufficient taxes to support a school, so J.M. Shepherd, owner of the N.E. 1/4 of Sec. 22, T. 13, R. 19, adjoining, had part of his land set over into Model District in order to increase their valuation enough to have a district.

The deed to the building site was drawn June 3, 1895, by Thomas and Sarah Pugh in favor of School District No. 83 for 1 3-20ths of an acre of land. A slight error in the legal description necessitated the drawing of a second deed August 2, to correct this. As corrected the legal description read: "Beginning at a stake 45 rods East of the Southwest corner of the S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 16, T. 13, R. 19, East of the P.M., thence running East 16 rods, thence North 11 1/2 rods, thence West 16 rods, thence South 11 1/2 rods to place of beginning."

On this plot a frame schoolhouse with a belfry, was erected in 1895, and the first term of school began in the fall of 1896. Noah Pugh, then six years old, started to school in the new schoolhouse where his first two teachers were John Akers and Ed Shepp. Mr. Pugh distinctly remembers also the old double desks and seats where the pupils sat and studied without regard as to whether their legs were long enough so that their feet would reach the floor or dangled all day in mid-air. The big bell rang every morning at 8:30 as a warning to those who dawdled, to hustle a little faster in order to reach the schoolhouse by 9 o'clock.

Model School, now a home for the Albert Lynch family, was located about two and one-half miles west of U.S. Highway No. 59 on the north side of the black-top road to Clinton, and had a sizeable pond or lake nearby, that furnished fine skating in winter. Both old and young of the community were very much at home on skates, and many skating parties were arranged for enjoyment on the smooth surface of this lake whenever the ice was safe.

An entertainment common at one time in this and other rural neighborhoods, was the Punch and Judy Show, put on by a professional ventriloquist who traveled through the country, making all the rural schools. Having secured permission from the board to use the schoolhouse, he would advertise his show by asking permission of the teacher to give the children a free ten-minute show in the late afternoon of show day. By a few sleight-of-hand tricks and the use of the two dummies, Punch and Judy, he would so fire the enthusiasm of the youngsters as to be very sure that they and their families would appear for the evening show, which was of course, not free.

The schoolhouse as usual, was the community center, where the literary society met and all the dinners, box and pie suppers were held. Whenever anything at all was going on at the schoolhouse, no one stayed at home.

The 1897-98 term was taught by Ed B. Shepp whose monthly salary was \$30.00 and enrollment 35. Total operating expense for the term was \$238.25 with board members J. Ulrich, A. E. Martin and J. J. Tobler. Names of those of school age in 1898 were: Fred ALLEN; Charles, Jackie, Bessie and Mildred BOWEN; Alva CARR; Jennie and Ella ELLIOTT; Clarence, Anna and Albert HASTIE; Liberty, Ed and Fred HILL; George LOWN; Jessie and Mattie MAN-SFIELD; James MARTEN; Mabel PALMATEER; Thomas, Mary, David, Nellie and Noah PUGH; Addie, Bell, Minnie and William RAMSEY; Golden Loren and Cloyce STARR; Theo. TOWLES; Lester, Mabel and Ethel ULRICH.

The 1898-99 term was taught by Lottie Brune and that of 1899-1900 by Vera Nelson.

Beginning with 1900 the teachers were Alma Nelson, Mrs. H.L. Kennedy, Lottie Brune, Minnie Kennedy, Lena Jones, Carrie Neal, and Myrtle Epley for the term ending in 1910. Board members were Wm. Miller, Frank Albaugh and G.F. Derby.

The next ten-year period had teachers Eunice Manter, Eda Hinchman, Verna Allis, Marjorie Axe, Tillie Render (Standard School), Ida E. Martin, Cassie Taylor, and Ethel Kalb for the term ending in 1920, with board members Arthur Holcom, Henry E. Beck and George Lown.

During this period, the treasurer's records reveal that new seats were purchased in 1917 for a total cost of \$214.38. In 1918-19 the belfry was repaired. R.E. Standing did the carpenter work, J.W. Jaedicke sold the screening necessary to keep out bees and wasps, and Grayson & Reinisch did the tin work. At this time the school was still using a combination of wood and coal for fuel.

Teachers of the 1920's were Kathryn McCaffrey, Florence Claxton, Hazel Charles, Edna Eberwein, and Alta Murray who taught the term ending in 1930 with a monthly salary of \$100.00 and enrollment of 33. Total operating expense for the term was \$1117.31 and board members, Al L. Holcom, Chas. E. Banning and George Lown.

The district purchased a used piano in 1922 for \$117.60, but the big improvement was the excavation of a basement under the entire schoolhouse, in order to install a furnace. This project cost the district almost \$700.00.

Alta Murray was the first teacher in the 1930's (4 terms), followed by Frances Metcalfe (5 terms), Mildred Petrie, and Mildred S. Ross who taught the term ending in 1940. Board members of that date were A.E. Holcom, Thomas Pugh and Geo. Lown.

Mildred S. Ross taught the first two terms of the 1940's giving her four consecutive terms, followed by Mrs. Edith Moses, Emma Petefish, and Helen Woodward for the 1944-45 and 1945-46 terms.

The school was closed for the next two terms and by arrangement with No. 6 the pupils were transported there. In 1948, the district asked Pleasant Valley No. 14 to take No. 83 into their district. This was accomplished and District No. 83 was annexed to District No. 14 by County Superintendent Margaret Hurley. The combined districts then known as "New" District No. 14, sold the old Model schoolhouse to Harry Richardson, Jr., for the sum of \$1025.00.

Others being near the wounded boy was taken home and Dr. MOTTRAM called who dressed his wounds and left him in comfortable a condition as possible under the circumstances. The doctor says that if the shot had entered the inside of the thigh instead of the outside the wound would have been fatal. As it is it will be very painful and take a good while to heal, but it is not at all dangerous.

A motion was made and carried that the treasurer buy a can of oil and lamp chimney for the society. An election resulted in the following officers: President, Lue FLORY; Vice-President, Arthur BRIDWELL; Secretary, Ella FLORY; Treasurer, Joe WILLIAMS; Sergeant-at-Arms, Lewis CHURCHBAUGH. Recess followed with a short program after. The society adjourned. No record of attendance was given.

Nov. 9, 1897 - Mr. BRIDWELL, the vice-president, called the meeting to order. In the business meeting, a motion was made and carried to publish a society paper once a month with Mr. BRIDWELL and Ella FLORY as the first editors. Also a motion was made and carried to have a debate only once a month. After recess and the program, the meeting adjourned. Nov. 16, 1897 - Mr. BRIDWELL, the vice-president, called the meeting to order. After the routine business meeting and recess, the program followed. The meeting adjourned. Those attending were: Arthur BRIDWELL, Harry STUDEBAKER, Walter DEARDORF, Henry DEARDORF, Lewis CHURCHBAUGH, Mr. KIMBERT, Fred FLORY, Maud FLORY, Vina CHURCHBAUGH, Joe WILLIAMS and Ella FLORY.

Nov. 23, 1897 - The meeting was called to order by Mr. BRIDWELL, the vice-president. A motion was made and carried that Mr. Lewis and Miss Mary CHURCHBAUGH would act as editors for the next paper. After recess and

After recess and the program came the debate question: Resolved, "that capital punishment should be abolished in the U.S." Judges decided in favor of the negative. The meeting adjourned. Those attending were: Lue FLORY, Ella FLORY, Arthur BRIDWELL, Henry BAKER, Hattie SANDERS, Charlie BROHAMMER, Dave WILLIAMS, Iva FLORY, Charlie PELLET, Vina CHURCHBAUGH, Maud FLORY, Harry STUDEBAKER, Earnest FLORY, Henry BAKER, Joe WILLIAMS and Alva FLORY.

Dec. 14, 1897 - The meeting was called to order by the president, Mr. BRIDWELL. Ella FLORY was acting secretary as Hattie SANDERS was absent. The debate was postponed for two weeks as all the speakers were not present. After recess and a short program, the meeting adjourned. The present were: Arthur BRIDWELL, Ella FLORY, Iva FLORY, Henry DEARDORF, Myrtle BOYD, Maud FLORY, Charlie PELLET, Vina CHURCHBAUGH, Lue FLORY, Mr. KIMBERT, Mr. MILLER, and Henry BAKER.

Dec. 21, 1897 - Mr. BRIDWELL, the president, called the meeting to order. After the business meeting, recess followed. A short program was presented and the society paper was read by Mr. Lewis CHURCHBAUGH and Miss Mary CHURCHBAUGH. The meeting adjourned.
