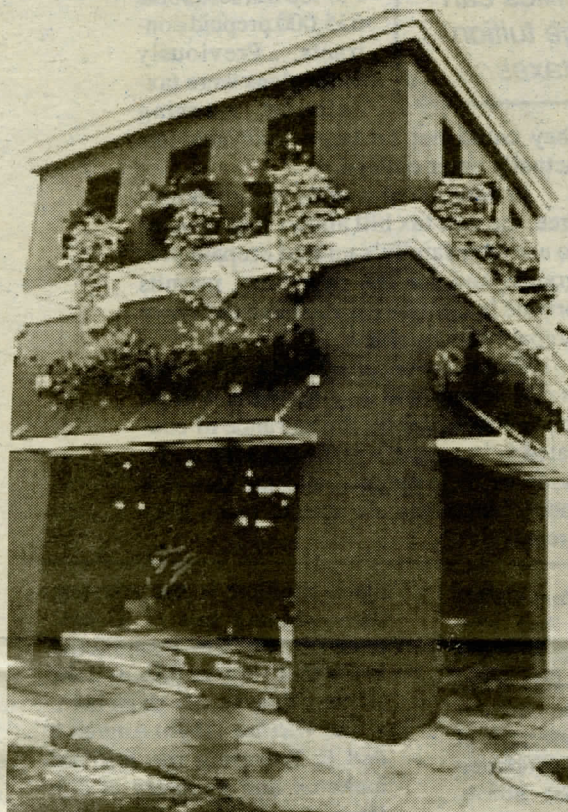

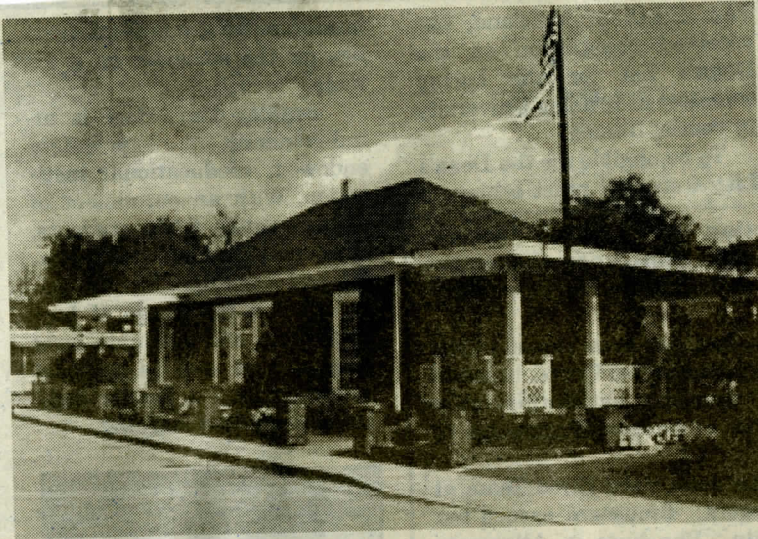

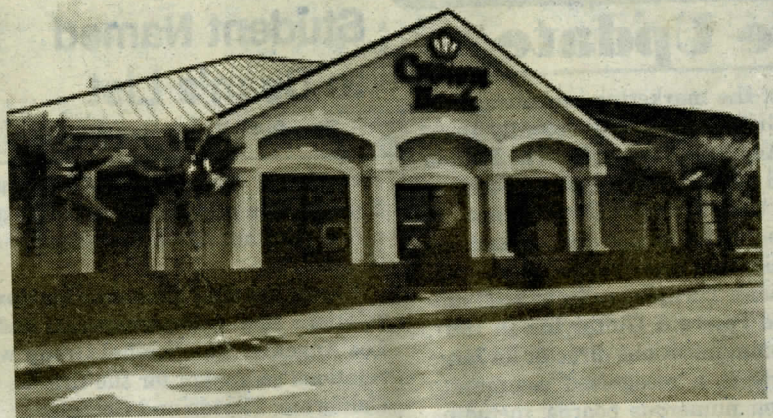

their time passing out hot dogs, organizing the children's games and more.

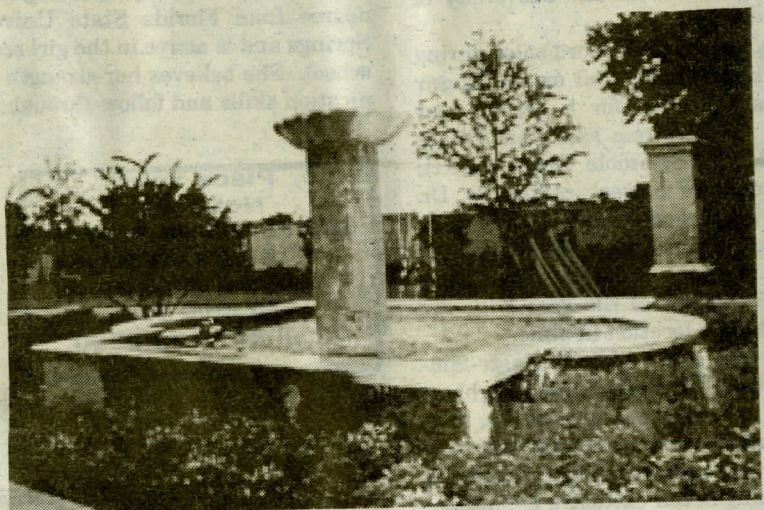
In addition, the Charles Hosmer Museum of American Art held a free open house, so that those attending the events in the park could enjoy American art and Tiffany treasures. The museum houses the
