## Fire Dept. and NFPA team up For Fire Prevention Week Oct. 3-9

uring this year's Fire Prevention Week (Oct. 3-9, 1999), the Fire Department will team up with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week, to execute "The Great Escape".

Launched by NFPA last fall, "The Great Escape" is a three-year public safety campaign designed to get more people to develop and practice a home fire escape plan than ever before.

As a way to actively participate in Fire Prevention Week, the department and NFPA invite Winter Park residents and employees to develop a home fire escape plan. Then on Oct. 6 at 7 p.m., Fire Department personnel will sound the horns of engines throughout the city as a "fire alarm" - the perfect time to practice your home fire escape. In addition, Fire Department personnel

will go to every nursery and elementary school in Winter Park to present a new and exciting 20-minute puppet show which teaches fire and injury prevention.

To end Fire Prevention Week, the department will host an open house at Station 61 (on the corner of New York and Lyman avenues) on Saturday Oct. 9 from 8 a.m. to 12 noon in conjunction with City Awareness Day.

During City Awareness Day the department will present the 20-minute puppet show as well as having health screenings.

## MDA Boot Drive best ever at \$18,307

inter Park firefighters were on the streets Aug. 31, Sept. 3 and Sept. 4 collecting for their annual "Fill the Boot Drive" for the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA). This year, firefighters collected their largest dollar amount - \$18,307 - on the corner of Aloma and Lakemont avenue and Fairbanks and Orlando avenue.

Engineer/Paramedic Ron Ryan is the MDA Coordinator for Winter Park and has been involved in raising money for MDA since he began working for Winter Park 12 years ago. "As long as I can remember, firefighters have had a history of doing this for MDA, " said Ron.
