It's spring and it's time to recycle. If it doesn't fit – if you don't like it anymore – if it clashes with your decor – if it you have duplicates – if you have too much "stuff" – if your home is cluttered – or if you just want to replace some things and need to get rid of the old, maybe its time for a garage sale! In that case, the city of Winter Park and Keep Winter Park Beautiful have the right solution for you.

Keep Winter Park Beautiful is inaugurating a "City for Sale" project the weekend following the city's Earth Day Celebration. Because garage sales or rummage sales are a means of recycling, they are encouraging any single individual, neighborhood group, church, school, or club to hold a sale during any portion of the April 21, 22 and 23 weekend. In other words, you may elect to have your sale on Friday and Saturday, Saturday and Sunday, or even a portion of Saturday only. You may keep any monies made or donate the proceeds to any group or charity you desire,

Keep Winter Park Beautiful will supply you with garage sale signs, trash bags for cleaning up afterward, car litter bags as giveaways for your customers, a map indicating the location of your sale, and, they will even take care of the publicity for you. They will advertise your sale in the *Winter Park-Maitland Observer* and the *Orlando Sentinel*, if you register by April 10.

If you are having a neighborhood sale or church or school garage sale, there will be free T-shirts for the organizers.

To register, simply fax your information to 407-599-3454. Let them know your chosen dates and time and at least 3 featured items you will be offering for sale. If you live within the city limits, you must have a permit which is available for \$5 from City Hall.

Good luck on your sale. It will help you with your spring cleaning and you will feel better, knowing that recycling is much better than throwing away. We would encourage you to donate any leftover items to a nonprofit organization or charity.
