WINTER PARK — A single-engine Cessna plane crashed into Lake Virginia Saturday morning, steering clear of water skiers and sunbathers on the shore by Rollins Col-

The pilot, 24-year-old Carlos Curti of Orlando, was not injured. He said the




plane's engine began losing power four or five minutes after leaving Orlando Executive Airport. Curti aimed for the lake when he realized he could not make it back to the airport.

"It was either land in the trees, a busy road where I could hurt people or the lake," he said. "The lake is a lot softer."

Curti, who said he has a student pilot's license and flies at least once a week, said he remained calm and tried to glide the plane down softly. He panicked only when water began rushing into the cockpit before he managed to escape.

"When I got scared was when I was strapped to the seat," he said. "My first re-
