

Earth Day Celebration Planned in Winter Park

An expanded Earth Day celebration is being planned by Keep Winter Park Beautiful as the local portion of Florida's great American Cleanup. Under the "Crying Indian" logo, KWPB, a volunteer board, invites all citizens to do their part to enhance the environment.

Schools celebrate Earth Day on Thursday, April 20, but working individuals and groups usually celebrate the week end before, the week end after, or both weekends.

Any effort during the month of April will qualify. Keep Winter Park Beautiful and the Neighborhood Association, which partners with KWPB, will celebrate Saturday, April 15. Grant Chapel/COAP, a partnership funded by the Winter Park Neighborhood Center for Families, has selected various days for their projects.

In conjunction with the annual Winter Park Spring Cleanup, KWPB will coordinate efforts and provide materials for grass

roots efforts to help clean up the city.

The public efforts, to which the public is invited, include painting a home for an individual with health and financial difficulties, painting park benches and trash cans in Central Park, and several clean up efforts. Just meet at the stage in Central Park at 8 a.m.
