We will adopt low-impact strategies wherever possible and will educate campers and staff on the care of the environment. We will follow the specific guidelines for environmental care set by the British Columbia Camping Association.

8.1 Recycling Policy

Whenever possible, materials are purchased with a view to environmental concerns.

A yellow recycling bin is provided and, where possible, waste materials are sorted and recycled or reused.

8.2 Waste Disposal

A covered dumpster is provided for the disposal of all waste after each meal.

Garbage is to be disposed of properly, in accordance with British Columbia regulations and in such a way as to minimize the risk of attracting animals.

8.3 Use of Disposable Items

In the interests of preserving the environment and minimizing impact on landfill sites, we will limit the use of disposable items in food preparation, serving and cookouts.
