MEDICAL CLINIC **UPDATE**

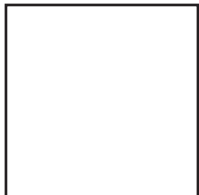
Construction on our new medical clinic is wrapping up. The next step in the process is finding a clinic administrator from the United States. We are currently looking for a medical missionary who will run the daily operations and lead the staff and volunteers at the clinic. The right person for this job will represent our ministry in a way that our desire to love Jesus, love others, and make disciples is clearly shown in word and daily action. This person will be responsible for ministering to the medical needs of those in the community and help short-term medical team members serve Christ through their medical abilities. We are looking for someone with the desire to be a servant of Christ by putting the needs of others before their own.

Dr. Mary Berg has agreed to serve as the Medical Director for the clinic. In this role she will act as the medical expert for the clinic and will lead medical teams to Haiti throughout the year. Dr. Berg is currently a family medicine physician

with Sanford Health in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. The goal for our medical clinic is to have 100% electronic medical records so that Dr. Berg can still oversee and monitor patients while she continues to work in the United States. When asked about this opportunity with Mission-Haiti, Dr. Berg said, “I am really looking forward to this opportunity because with Mission-Haiti I will get to serve others through Christ.”

Thank you to everyone who supported this process financially, with your time and energy, and with your prayers! We are very excited for the clinic to open so that the Great Physician’s power can be seen there. We feel blessed to be able to improve health care and improve the quality of life for the people of Southwest Haiti. †

IMPACT STORY ▼

Yona and his little brother are two young boys that live in the area where Mission-Haiti serves. In 2015 the boys’ mom had breathing complications that doctors were unable to figure out, she passed away later that year. The boys and their father lived in a small worn-down house until it was demolished to rubble when Hurricane Mathew ripped through Southwest Haiti in 2016.

2 Corinthians 5:1 – “For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.”

Following the hurricane, the two boys and their father moved into their grandma’s house along with two aunts and their children. There are currently ten people living in grandma’s small patched up house with a tarp roof that is so battered and ripped they get wet in the night. The boys’ dad does an incredible job taking care of his two sons on his own. He tries to save money to fix the house but he has to use

the little that he makes to support his children. Both Yona and his brother are in school and the three of them belong to a church not too far from their house.

Matthew 7:25 – “And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock.”

Thanks to the donation of a generous sponsor couple, Yona and his family will be getting a new tarp for the time being but Mission-Haiti will also be building them a new home! It is only through our sponsors that we are able to show the love of Christ to families like Yona’s. It is our mission to seek out the vulnerable in our communities and be the hands and feet of Jesus to them.
