INCOMING 9th GRADE VALIDATION AND ADVANCEMENT

1. Math

All ninth-grade students will take Geometry in the freshman year. In consultation with their Guidance Counselor, students will be evaluated according to their previous Math courses to determine if they will take Algebra 1 or Algebra 2 and Trigonometry in sophomore year.

2. World Language

If a student is currently taking Spanish, French or Latin and would like to seek advancement into the level 2 course, s/he may take the Validation Exam in that language on Saturday, June 3, 2023 at 9 A.M.

3. Science

All ninth-grade students will take Biology in the freshman year. If a student has already taken a Regents level course in Biology (Living Environment) and evidences on the 8th grade report card a grade of 70% or higher on the Regents Exam he or she may be exempt from Biology. In this case a freshman student would take Chemistry in the ninth grade.

Triple “A” Program - Atmosphere, Adjustment, Awareness

Triple A is a full three days of programming specifically designed for the 9th grade student. This provides orientation to the academic, apostolic, and extracurricular activity life at Kellenberg. The students meet their teachers and guidance counselor as well as their Senior Marianist Leaders who provide mentorship and service throughout the school year.

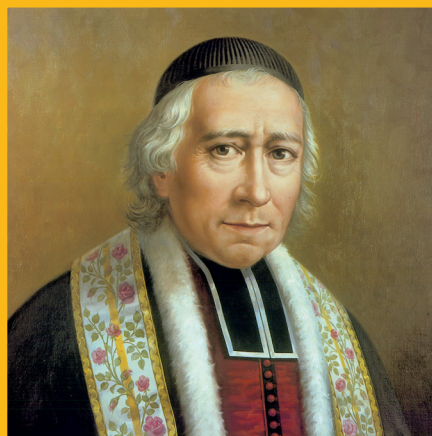

- **Uniforms:**
The complete uniform must be worn at all times. Uniforms may be purchased through Land's End at 1-800-963-4816, School ID 900168121 and Flynn O'Hara at 516-221-3006.
- **Dress and Appearance:**
Kellenberg Memorial High School has a code of dress and appearance. All students are expected to have a neat, well-groomed appearance.
- **Attendance:**
Students are expected to be in school and on time on all days when school is in session. Class days are noted on the School Calendar.
- **Transportation:**
Most school districts provide transportation to each enrolled student. Contact your local school district for more information on arranging transportation.
- **Cell Phones:**
Cell phones are never to be used in the school building to make or receive calls while school is in session. Phones must be turned off and secured in the student's locker during the school day. In case of an emergency please consult the Dean. This also applies to all wearable technology.
- **Bullying and Harassment:**
Kellenberg Memorial High School maintains a zero tolerance for bullying. Harassment in any form is prohibited, including electronics and internet.
- **Detention:**
Kellenberg Memorial High School students are expected to maintain a normal grade of Christian conduct of Civility, Order, and Respect. Students involved in any noteworthy failure to observe rules of conduct or application to required work are referred to the Dean.

Athletic Attendance Policy

All student-athletes are permitted a maximum of two unexcused absences from practices / games. An unexcused absence is defined as an absence that is not due to one of the following: a documented medical reason, participation in the Parish Religious Education Program (P.R.E.P.), and participation in the Marianist Mentor Program. If a third unexcused absence occurs, the student-athlete may be removed from the team.

Unexcused absences also include family vacations during school recess times, (Christmas, Winter Break, Easter).

Activities and Athletics

An important part of the high school experience is the participation with fellow students and faculty members in the various activities and athletic teams of personal interest. Kellenberg Memorial High School offers a full range of sports and activities which stimulate and develop the interests of each student. Co-curricular activities allow the student to pursue interest and talents related to the course of study. Extracurricular activities give the student a chance to serve and to pursue interests not directly related to their studies. Athletics, on both the intramural and interscholastic levels, combine physical development and exercise with competition and enjoyment.

Kellenberg Memorial has a robust after school program. Last year, as we emerged from Covid restrictions, 88% (482/584 students) of the freshman class were involved in at least one sport or activity. 64% (351 freshmen) participated in sports and 59% (326 freshmen) participated in activities. 36% (198) of those freshmen were in both an activity and a sport. It is highly recommended that your son or daughter participate in some sport or activity, so they are not missing a vital part of their high school experience. A happy freshman is an involved freshman.
