**MAC Resolution**

**WHEREAS**, Samford University is a diverse institution with students from many nations, religious backgrounds, and ethnic and racial identifications, and

**WHEREAS**, the Student Government Association works to promote an inclusive environment for all students, and

**WHEREAS**, there is a need for a resource on campus to provide organizations the opportunity to learn about cultural competency, and

**WHEREAS**, Article 306.10 of the Code of Laws requires that all ad hoc committees be proposed by a resolution in the Senate,

**BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE STUDENT SENATE OF SAMFORD UNIVERSITY**, that an ad hoc committee for Multicultural Affairs be created for the 2016-17 school year.

1. The purpose of this committee will be to train the 10 selected students to serve as diversity peer educators. These MAC members will serve as a resource to the student body and its organizations in order to advance cultural competency on our campus. In addition, this committee will provide valuable insight to the Student Executive Board to improve multicultural affairs on our campus.
2. The committee will exist for one academic year (2016-2017).
3. The committee will meet twice per month.
4. The members will be Maria Aguilera, Kevin Aparicio, Holland Bayles, Marn Hoe Chong, William Hargrove, Britany Morgan, Sierra Outerbridge, Joyeuse Senga, Angel Sims, and Sarah Cate Williamson. John Kegley, SGA Chaplain, will serve as an ex officio member.
5. Porter Rivers, SGA President, will chair the committee. Jenée Spencer, Program Assistant to the Office of Diversity, will oversee this committee.
6. The chair will report to the Student Executive Board after each committee meeting (twice a month).
