Boston College Law School grants reciprocal services to students and graduates of ABA-accredited law schools located outside the Boston metro area that offer the same or similar services to our students and graduates. In the case of schools that permit reciprocity on a one-to-one basis, we will limit the number of referrals in the same manner.

In order to request reciprocity at BC Law School, please ask a representative from your law school's career services office to email a request on your behalf to our team at law.career@bc.edu that includes the following information about you:

- Name
- Class/Graduation Year
- Email Address
- Phone number
- Desired start date for access

Reciprocity Policy

- **Access to Resources**

Individuals approved for reciprocity at BC Law are granted in-office access to review job postings in our online database, SAGE, and reference library resources. Access to Career Services resources other than job postings and reference library resources is not available. When submitting applications using BC Law resources, applicants must state that they have received access to the job listing through a reciprocal agreement with BC Law.
- **Eligibility**
 - 3Ls and graduates
 - Reciprocity is not available to students or alumni of Boston-area law schools or to individuals who have previously been granted reciprocity by another Boston-area law school.
- **Duration & Timing**
 - Reciprocity will not be granted during the recruitment period of July 1 to November 1.
 - Reciprocity access is granted for a period not to exceed three months from the date of the first visit or until July 1, whichever comes first.
- **Visiting the BC Law Career Services Office**
 - Individuals seeking reciprocity must first receive approval of their reciprocity request before contacting the BC Law Career Services Office to schedule an on-site visit.
 - Services are available during regular business hours of Monday through Friday, 9 AM to 5 PM. Please note that the office closes at 3 PM on Fridays during the summer.
 - Individuals granted reciprocity should confirm availability of resources and schedule visit(s) in advance by email to law.career@bc.edu.
 - The student/graduate must bring a copy of the letter granting reciprocal access and a photo ID on every visit.
