OSAGE MINERALS COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES November 20, 2019

1. Call to order

Chairman Waller calls the meeting to order at 10:07am.

2. Opening prayer

Councilman RedEagle gave the opening prayer and reading of deceased Osages.

3. Roll call

4. Superintendent's Report

Deputy Superintendent Winlock says on the Superintendent's report in the Branch of Field of Operations there were 19 trucking permits were prepared, 46 gas meter reports scanned into Osage Nation Report, 12 Well plugging's witnessed, 23 leases checked for production/primary term, 96 lease inspections, 20 lease inspections/follow-up, 6 Gas Meter provings, 10 tank trucks checked for permits, 22 tank strappings witnessed, 83 landowner/lessee meetings, 7 complaints responded to, 8 spills/leaks inspected, 13 spill/leaks inspected/follow-ups, 89 tanks gauged, 2 run tickets figured, and 4 gauger's cal vs. purchaser's cal. The Branch of Lease Management there were 31 pending leases awaiting for approval, assignments there were 23 approved 11450, division orders there were 20 approved, and leases terminated were 31. Deputy Superintendent Winlock says oil and gas rentals collected were \$6,240 dollars, oil and gas bonus collected were zero. water usage royalty paid was \$666.60, wells producing October 2019 of 14,848 less 3,232 for SWD wells. Deputy Superintendent Winlock says other minerals sales under part 214 production sale reported per lease APAC was 32,959.13 tons for royalty paid of \$41,667.13, Burbank Maters production was 12,654.71 tons for royalty paid of \$13,413.99, Candy Creek Crusher production was 9,884.97 tons for royalty paid of \$8,550.50, Schmidt Brothers 416 cubic yards for royalty paid of \$312.00, and Rocky Banks production of 42 cubic yards for royalty paid of \$35.00. Deputy Superintendent Winlock says the Branch of Subsurface Minerals approved drilling permits were zero, *Recording skips the following: According to the Superintendent report is listed that approved workover permits were 11, approved plugging permits were 2 + 3 Emergency Pluggings = 5, completed new wells this month were Performance Group, LLC Infield Brown 17-4 completed 10/29/2019 with a reported production of 16 BOPD, Spyglass Energy Group, LLC West Blackland 3-35 completed 10/24/2019 with a reported production of 17 BOPD, Spyglass Energy Group, LLC West Blackland 4-34 completed 10/24/2019 with a reported production of 15 BOPD, Spyglass Energy Group, LLC South Red Eagle 1-34 completed 10/24/2019 with a reported production of 13 BOPD, and Warrior Exploration & Production LLC Whitehorn 7-35 completed 10/24/2019 with a

reported production of 25 BOPD. Deputy Superintendent Winlock says Branch of Enforcement and Lease Compliance says the number of EA's received for 214 leases were zero, number of EA's received for APD's were 2 EA for 5 Permits, NOA's published for EA's were 9, Number of non-compliance letters were 30, Number of nonproduction letters were 32, number of fine letters were zero, number of penalty letters were zero. Number of extensions letters were two, Number of further remediation letters were zero, Number of final notice letters were zero, Number of spill closure letters were zero, Number of Spill Remediation and Reporting Notice letters were 12, and Number of exemption approval letters were 2.* *Recording resumes* Councilman Revard says he told him we had this issue and said that maybe we could get one of the purchasers like Coffeyville to do a one-time division order showing that Osage Nation is a 100% the owner of the oil. Councilman Revard says the Superintendent's office according to the Deputy here says they would approve such a division order. Councilman Revard says it might be helpful for the purchaser to have a resolution. Deputy Superintendent Winlock says Mr. Revard asked about setting the tank battery and that's an excellent idea to do if you've got the property somewhere a site for a couple of things and as you're plugging these wells accumulating fluids you could put them in those tanks. Deputy Superintendent Winlock says before you get a permanent division order from whichever purchaser that way they could pick it up. Councilman Revard says to maybe do a particular division order for particular tank batteries for all of the wells we end up working on. Councilwoman Harlan says that she would make the motion to send this back to their committee to develop a plan of how we want to proceed with all wells that are like this and bring it back to the council, seconded by Councilwoman Gray. Councilman Revard says currently we have 500 barrel tank we are leasing we have oil in it at some point we'll have to drain it. Councilman Revard says we need to have it picked up and taken somewhere. Councilman Redcorn says we have Tim Dowd on a resolution already passed and that we can grab most of the value out of these and the rest of it goes to the shareholders. Councilman Redcorn says if it's okay with the council we will have a conversation with Mr. Dowd and come back with the plan. Councilman Revard says it's capable of production and that our geologist thinks it will primarily be a gas well. Councilman Revard says once we get this surface casing in put a well head on it and close it in it is no longer an emergency but it's not a well we might be plugging. Councilman Revard says we're going to move from plugging a well to potentially completing a well or testing it for completion, and says that our funds are not for that purpose. Councilman Revard says we need to speak with Tammy Leeper before we spend another dime on securing a well. Councilman Redcorn says these are steps we do in the Orphan Well and that's why we procured Tim Dowd. Councilman Redcorn says they can reach out to the Well Plugging Committee with all the information found and cost if we can develop on our side and present to the council. Councilwoman Gray says now is a good time to activate our Business Development Committee to where we're able to work and accord with these committees. Councilwoman Harlan amends motion to table this matter and that the Orphan Well Committee work with the individuals necessary to create a comprehensive plan. Councilwoman Gray amends her second. Mr.Short says he is asking that the Council grant him a short term lease to get that drilled maybe this next summer.

Motion by 2nd Chair Yates to grant Short Oil Company a one year lease for 0 bonus 20% oil and gas for SE of section 2 township 25 north range 8 east, seconded by Councilman Redcorn.

Councilman Revard asks that 2nd Chair Yates for amending his motion to allow for extension of the current lease if we were able to accomplish that.
