#### 4. Superintendent Report – Cammi Canady

Ms. Canady states the superintendent report is as follows: Total oil produced 310,686.79, royalties paid \$3,506,765.46, total gas produced 187,814 MCF, royalties paid \$52,334.87, total gas liquids 145,487 gallons, royalties paid \$17,107.88, total tank bottom 229.68, royalties paid \$331.27, water usage royalty paid \$575.00 and waste disposal royalty paid \$14,571.03. Rentals/Bonus – Oil and Gas Rentals Paid \$4,792.28, Oil and Gas Bonus Paid \$9,500.00, Rental \$0.00, Saltwater Easement Rental \$3,300.00, and Late Payment Charges \$222.11. Aggregates - APAC produced 20,790.29 tons and paid \$24,594.91 in royalty. Candy Creek Crusher produced 6,312.32 tons and paid \$6,236.57 in royalty. Burbank Materials produced 12,578.69 tons and paid \$19,119.60 in royalty. Rocky Banks produced 18 cubic yards and paid \$15.00 in royalty. Wilson Ranch produced 0 tons and paid \$0 in royalty.
