Gossip: What It Is, and What It Is Not

To Define Gossip:

As a noun: Small talk or chatter about someone, often about things heard from others, but not known to be a fact. (Webster's New World Dictionary Handbook: The Elementary Edition).

Telling news whether truth or lie if with malice to injure or for personal gratification or revenge Is Never Good, or Profitable!

Respect them that are due respect and honor them that labor for the kingdom sake.

What about others that dishonor themselves, that bring shame to the church? Should not we warn the church? Let us look into the word of God, The Holy Bible.

111 John v.9-11 Di-ot-re-phes- Name meaning nurtured by love, "Spoiled"

He loved authority or presidency. Recognition. He would not give respect to the Apostolical Authority, by honoring or respecting them.

Was John Guilty of Gossip? No

II Timothy 4:14-18 Al-ex-Ander the coppersmith. This Alexander is possible the same in Act 19-33 or Tim. 1-20. To whom the Apostle was under obligation to excommunicate so that the gospel could have free course. The apostle was a good watchman. Ezek 3:17-21

II Tim. 2-16. Paul warns of false teachers. Hy-me-naeus and Phi-le-tus giving their names.

IITim.3-6 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is <u>profitable for doctrine</u>. For <u>reproof</u>, for <u>correction</u>, for <u>instruction and righteousness</u>.

How about wreckless malicious gossip?

There is a definition for that:

1. Telling news whether truth or lie. The one that carries a lie is just as guilty as the one that started the lie.
