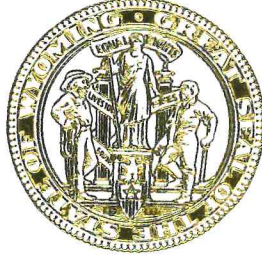


Governor's Proclamation

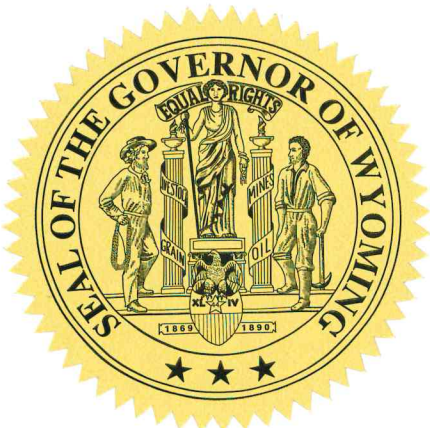
WHEREAS, PAs have been a crucial asset to Wyoming's response to the COVID-19 Pandemic.
