

Denisse benefited from being part of the honors program and credits CUC faculty with thoroughly preparing her for the rigors of medical school—and with helping to hone her empathy skills. "I want to make my patients feel the way my professors made me feel," says Denisse. "My professors' care and attention left a lasting impression. They were amazing role models who really cared and listened to what I had to say and would help me in any way."

Now a pediatric resident at Loma Linda University Children's Hospital in California, Denisse's research focus is inflammatory bowel disease (IBD) in children. Inspired by the experience of her younger sister, Denisse hopes to enhance understanding of the disease and improve the quality of life of children suffering from IBD. Denisse also plans to pursue a master's degree in public health focusing on maternal child medicine, examining how a mother's socioeconomic, health and educational status affects her children's health.

## SERVICE COMMITMENT EARNS CUC NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Concordia University Chicago has been named to the President's Higher

Education Community Service Honor Roll five times. This honor "highlights the role colleges and universities play in solving community problems and placing more students on a lifelong path of civic engagement by recognizing institutions that achieve meaningful, measurable outcomes in the communities they serve."

Though service has always been a core part of the student experience at Concordia University Chicago, with the appointment of a full-time director of the program, the scope of service learning impacting each student's experience has expanded.

"Service learning is tied to the content of the class, and it helps students realize these issues aren't just topics in a textbook that they read and talk about in class," says Professor Alannah Ari Hernandez, director of academic service learning. "Students get to see firsthand up close. It makes the theoretical aspects they are learning in class more concrete."

We match our students' talents with community needs to potentially change and improve the lives of others. Here are just two ways CUC students are making an impact:

- Some Concordia students work as mentors in after-school mentoring sessions with Youth Outreach Services, serving Chicago's West Side and west suburban communities.
- Members of Concordia's non-partisan conservation organization met with local and state politicians and lobbied for the Electronic Products Recycling & Reuse Act, or E-Scrap bill, to set up a government-run recycling program for electronics that contain mercury, lead and other environmental toxins.


## CONCORDIA INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT FEVER

Residence life at Concordia is dynamic, with 41 percent of traditional undergraduate students (67 percent of freshmen) living on campus. Campus life is about what happens outside of class, which often are the most memorable college experiences.
