Dear Friends,

I would like to open this greeting with a quote from Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker that we can all take pride in. The spontaneous burst of applause that followed reminded me how fortunate we are to have the support of such a dedicated, loyal, even intrepid group of Joslin champions—patients, their families and friends, clinicians, researchers, educators, members of our boards and staff standing shoulder to shoulder to advance our mission.

Until a cure is found, our goal is the picture of health for all patients. Our cover photo of Joslin Marie, named in honor of the care her mother received, is a rewarding example of a healthy outcome for patients with access to the optimal care and resources that Joslin makes possible.


By her own admission, Joslin Marie's mother Elizabeth found her diagnosis of type 1 diabetes at age nine tough to take. And it didn't get any easier as she grew into adolescence and then a young adult. "I didn't like being told what to eat and what not to eat, how to live my life and that I had a few too many high or low sugars," Elizabeth said, but "slowly, I started to realize that [Joslin] was what would change my life. It was becoming more special to me as I grew older and wiser. . . . and a little less stubborn."

Elizabeth's journey through Joslin's Pediatric, Adolescent and Young Adult Section, and ultimately, the Joslin-Beth Israel Pregnancy Program, was transformative for her, as it has been for thousands of others. We've come a long way since the fetal success rate—the number of babies born to mothers with diabetes who survived—was 54%, the norm in 1924 when trailblazer Priscilla White, MD, joined Dr. Joslin's practice. Fifty years later when Dr. White retired, the rate had risen to over 90%.

Today, through research like that being done in the laboratory of Dr. Mary Loeken, Investigator in the Section on Islet Cell and Regenerative Biology, we are making discoveries that will affect mothers of the future. Dr. Loeken has discovered a molecular pathway responsible for neural tube defects in diabetic pregnancies, which may lead to more competent stem cells to repair congenital malformations.

If Joslin were solely a clinic, or dedicated exclusively to research, or an institution focused only on shaping medical innovations, we would be worthy of your support. But we are more than the sum of our individual components and because so, your philanthropy is having an impact on the wider diabetes spectrum and the fully realizable goal of the picture of health.

Your generosity is vital to our quest and ensures that our efforts will have the greatest possible impact on the health and well-being of everyone living with diabetes—and that Governor Baker's remarks will remain relevant for generations to come. Thank you!

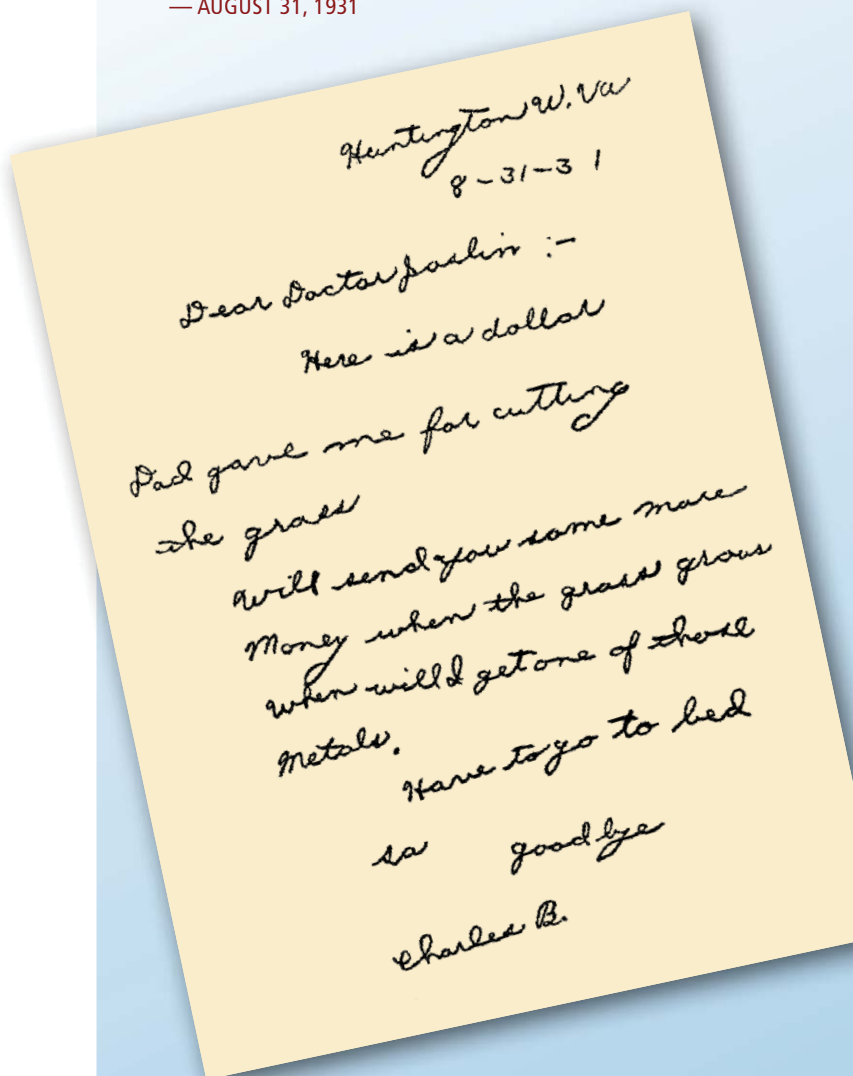

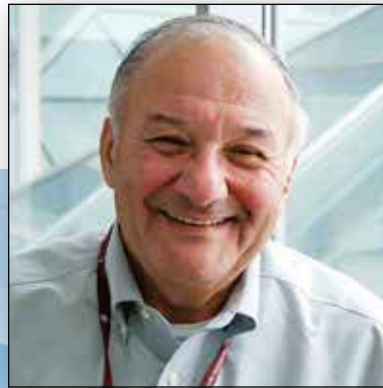
Personalized patient-centered care is the hallmark of Joslin and the grateful patient notes included throughout this publication speak to that.

LIFE-CHANGING CARE: PAYING IT FORWARD

To learn of Debbie Maloney's morning routine is to get a glimpse into how she has faced adversity—and embraces each day. A cancer survivor who was diagnosed with type 1 diabetes at age 17, a busy professional, and mother of a daughter about to turn six years old, Debbie rises at 5:30 a.m. each day to begin her workouts on the elliptical machine.

Sometimes her daughter wakes with her and sits nearby, busily involved in craftwork. Recently, Debbie's daughter asked her mother's age. The answer generated a classic, out-of-the-mouths-of-babes response:

"Wow. Do you think you'll still be alive when I'm in high school?"

"On dark mornings when getting out of bed to exercise seems like pure folly, I think of my daughter's answer, chuckle and put on my sneakers," says Debbie. "The gauntlet has been thrown! I have many reasons to eat well, exercise and take care of my health. I plan to remind my daughter of that story at my grandchildren's graduations."

Debbie's odyssey to health and to Joslin is a story with many plot twists and heroic characters, most notably, her husband Neil, her physicians and loving friends.

Debbie Maloney first came to Joslin almost 20 years ago seeking a better level of care for her diabetes. Glucometers back then had just come on the market and were about the size of a paperback book, she recalls. An accounting major with a love of all things culinary, she decided to take a year off to pursue a degree in the culinary arts, *"to maximize flavor and pleasure in eating well and make the most of my suggested eating plan."*

Her then boyfriend Neil supported her while she was in school. Not long after she completed her degree, Neil entered law school and she returned the favor. They soon became engaged, *"scraped together \$2,000 for a party"* and were married. Anticipating long nights at the law library, the newlyweds moved to New Hampshire and Debbie began commuting to her job in Boston.

Six months later, she noticed a swollen node in her neck. *"I thought I was getting a cold,"* she remembers. Coincidentally, Debbie had an appointment that week to see her Joslin endocrinologist, Dr. Elizabeth Bashoff. Dr. Bashoff scheduled some tests and referred Debbie to an oncologist, Dr. James Levine, at the then Deaconess Hospital. The diagnosis was stage

3A Hodgkin's lymphoma, which would mean six months of chemotherapy and possible radiation therapy.

"I was carrying our health insurance and wasn't certain how I would be able to commute, work and deal with chemotherapy and diabetes. With the empathy of some of his professors, my husband was able to coordinate his schedule and classes around my treatments." Initially, Debbie was able to return to work within 48 hours after chemotherapy, but as the course of treatment wore on, the 90-minute commute each way became too exhausting.

The treatment was not only physically challenging, but quickly became financially burdensome for the couple. *"We had no assets and the bills were staggering. It wasn't unusual to open a bill that totaled \$500, \$2,000, \$8,000 for one type of treatment or visit. My doctors assured me that as long as I came in for necessary treatments they would figure out a way to make it work with the billing offices. I was a jaded New Englander who was amazed that any institution truly cared that much about a patient who couldn't pay their bills—I was humbled, grateful and motivated to continue with my appointments,"* noted Debbie.

"By the end of my chemotherapy treatments, I didn't need radiation and managing diabetes seemed like an easier task. My hair grew back, my husband graduated and we moved to San Francisco for him to begin his work."

Fast forward nearly five years and Debbie and Neil have returned to their New Hampshire roots. Making the change from food writer

to manager of accounting and human resources in Neil's quickly growing law firm has been professionally satisfying and enjoyable, says Debbie.

"Neil's firm is a sponsor of the Joslin High Hopes Gala and we look forward to it every year."

Joslin helped me when I needed it and we always vowed that if we could ever give back in a meaningful way—we would. That goal has been reached and we've enjoyed every minute of every Gala, taking friends and business associates along with us for the ride. We hope some of the fundraising goes to help those who need care at Joslin and who may not be able to afford it. Everyone with diabetes should have the opportunity to receive the same level of care that I have received at Joslin."

Joslin Supports Senators Collins and Shaheen's New Legislation to Extend Medicare Coverage for CGMs

Dear Senator Collins and Senator Shaheen:

On behalf of the Joslin Diabetes Center and the tens of thousands of patients for whom we and our Joslin Affiliated Centers provide care, I am writing to strongly support, S. 2689, the 'Medicare CGM Access Act of 2014'. As you know, Medicare does not provide coverage for the continuous glucose monitor (CGM), a physician-prescribed, U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved treatment. Our clinical data clearly demonstrates that use of a CGM reduces low blood sugars because of hypoglycemic unawareness, delays and prevents long-term complications and greatly improves patients' and families' quality of life. Passage of this legislation is especially important for the Joslin Medalists, a group of people who have had diabetes for at least 50 years.

Virtually all leading diabetes professional societies recommend CGM usage and it is covered by most private health plans. Your thoughtfully crafted legislation would provide Medicare coverage for CGMs and also help advance development of the artificial pancreas where the CGM is a critical component. CGM use improves control and saves money – both in the short- and long-term.

Many Americans aging into the Medicare program are successfully managing their diabetes using a CGM – an essential piece of their prescribed treatment plan. These patients will lose access to this care without Medicare coverage on the day they become Medicare beneficiaries. Additionally, many people now on Medicare should be using a CGM but are unable to afford it. The CGM enables them to maximize time spent in a healthy blood sugar range while minimizing incidents of dangerous hypoglycemia, something our health care teams see increasing among older adults with diabetes.

Your legislation is consistent with a core goal of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services – strengthening the Medicare program for all beneficiaries and encouraging innovation. It also provides a pathway for coverage of artificial pancreas systems when they are approved for use in the clinical care setting. They will make managing Type 1 diabetes safer, easier and simpler and will be life changing for the T1D community.

Joslin appreciates your strong leadership by introducing S. 2689, which will have a positive impact on the millions of people living with Type 1 diabetes. Thank you for taking a stand and we look forward to working with you in helping improve the lives of the millions of people living with diabetes.

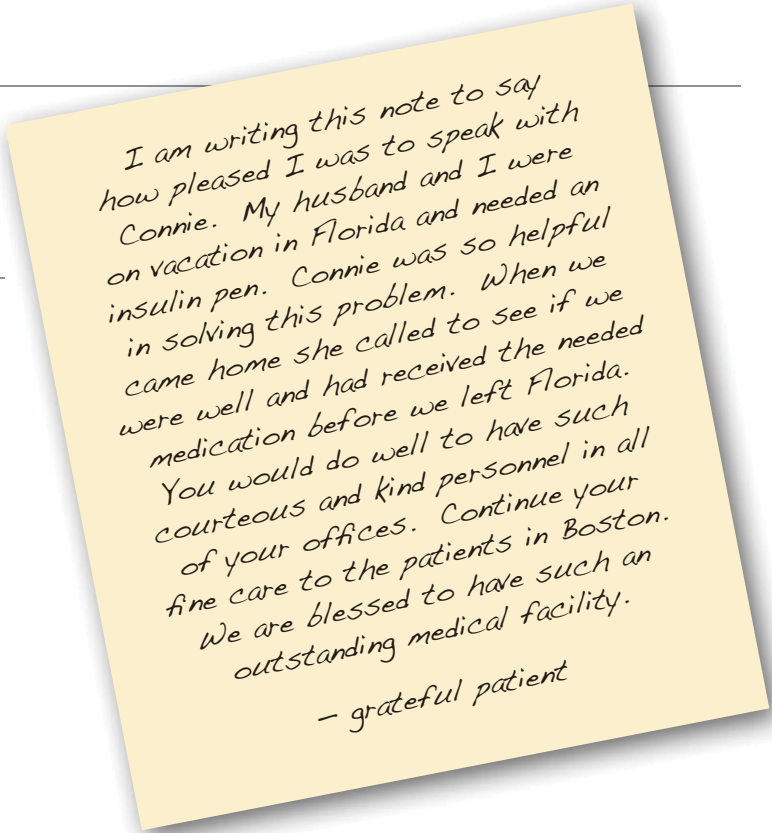

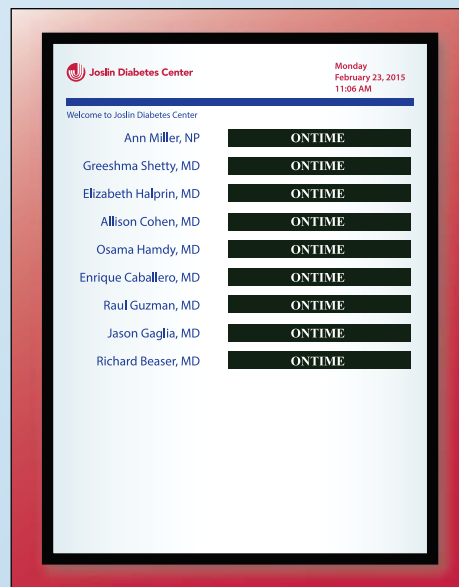
A generous gift from Mr. James to create the 2014 Clinical Innovation Awards has inspired Clinic staff “to brainstorm on how to provide even better care to our patients,” said Robert Gabbay, MD, PhD, FACP, Chief Medical Officer and Senior Vice President at Joslin. The Clinic Innovation Awards Committee focused on identifying the most innovative projects that could impact the most patients while also having the ability to be tested and implemented within a six-month timeframe.

“What stood out most about the chosen projects is that they all impact different populations at Joslin and each recipient came up with an innovative care delivery system that can potentially be implemented throughout the entire Clinic,” noted Gabbay. The Awards Committee received eleven applications, and after careful consideration, chose three to receive the Award.

Postpartum Intervention in Type 1 Diabetes – The POINT Study

The POINT Study was designed as a pilot project to determine whether glucose control, diet and physical activity in postpartum women with type 1 diabetes could be improved through an educational intervention that employs newly designed web-based platforms accessible from home. Despite achieving target A1C levels during pregnancy, women often return to their pre-pregnancy A1C levels following birth, suggesting that self-management skills attained during pregnancy need to be reinforced postpartum. The pilot project has enabled Dr. Brown and her team to determine the study’s feasibility; she has since applied for a larger grant through Harvard Catalyst to obtain more robust preliminary data for submission of an NIH grant.



New Wait Time Digital Dashboard in the Clinic

Managing Wait Time Expectations

The goal of this project was to develop an internet-based digital dashboard monitoring display system that provides up-to-the-minute information to patients regarding wait times, registration and financial assistance, as well as privacy information and wellness tips. The Wait Time Digital Dashboard was installed in November, and since then, 4,000 patients have visited the Adult Clinic. Feedback from patients, clinicians and staff has been “overwhelmingly positive.” In addition, the dashboard will be showcased to Joslin Affiliates who have indicated interest in adopting the system.

2014 Clinical Innovation Awards

Improving Care of High-Risk Adolescents and Young Adults with Type 1 Diabetes

This project aimed to create an innovative program to improve the care and outcomes of high-risk adolescents and young adults with type 1 diabetes. First, a tracking system was designed to identify and follow adolescents and young adults who had poor glycemic control, multiple missed appointments or had recent hospitalizations for diabetic ketoacidosis. Then a variety of new resources were made available to encourage and improve communication between patients and the Clinic and increase support for this high-risk group. Resources included availability of a Joslin Care Ambassador, a unique walk-in clinic, the use of new technology, and integration of social and peer interactions into medical visits. In a survey conducted at the end of the six-month period, all patients indicated the Take Charge clinic was useful and that they would like to attend another session. One of the most frequently cited benefits of the program was use of text messaging to provide visit reminders and support between visits. Wentzell and her team plan to seek additional sources of funding for the successful program.

Lifetime Achievement Award

Friends, family and colleagues of Joslin researcher **Robert G. Spiro, MD**, gathered in November to celebrate his impressive contributions to the field of diabetes research spanning more than 60 years. Dr. Spiro joined the Joslin faculty in 1961 and established the Glycoproteins and Biomembranes research laboratory, where he discovered links between diabetes and chronic kidney disease. "Dr. Spiro turned the tide of scientific fundamentals in the treatment of diabetes," said Donna Younger, MD, Senior Physician at Joslin's Adult Clinic, and the first of four recipients to receive a Joslin Lifetime Achievement Award. "It took some time until the scientific community surrendered its resistance to the idea that complications of diabetes were the result of disordered glucose metabolism, but the progress in understanding started with his discoveries."

A 50-Year Medalist, Robert Spiro diagnosed himself with type 1 diabetes in his final year of medical school. He has since managed his diabetes, without complications, for sixty years, crediting his wife Dr. Mary Jane Spiro and "the distinguished group of physicians" including those at Joslin, with his good health. In 2004 he established the Robert G. Spiro MD Endowed Campership Fund, which provides financial assistance for children to attend Camp Joslin.

The Medical City Philippines serves 40,000 in-patients and 400,000 out-patients annually.

Champalimaud Award, World's Most Prestigious Award for Vision

George King, MD, Chief Scientific Officer and Senior Vice President of Joslin Diabetes Center and Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, and **Lloyd Paul Aiello, MD, PhD**, Director of the Beetham Eye Institute (BEI) and Professor of Ophthalmology at Harvard Medical School, were among seven individuals, including colleagues from Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary, Genentech and UC San Diego, to receive the 2014 Antonio Champalimaud Vision Award for their contributions toward the discovery of treatments inhibiting vascular endothelial growth factor (VEGF) for eye diseases.

As the world's largest award for vision research, the Champalimaud Award is presented to active researchers involved in basic or clinical research that has led to a major breakthrough in the understanding and preservation of vision. The award of \$1 million euros (approximately \$1.3 million dollars) was presented during a ceremony at the headquarters of the Champalimaud Foundation in Lisbon, Portugal, and will be shared among the seven recipients. "It is important to note that this research would have not been possible without the unique environment that exists here at Joslin," said Dr. King.

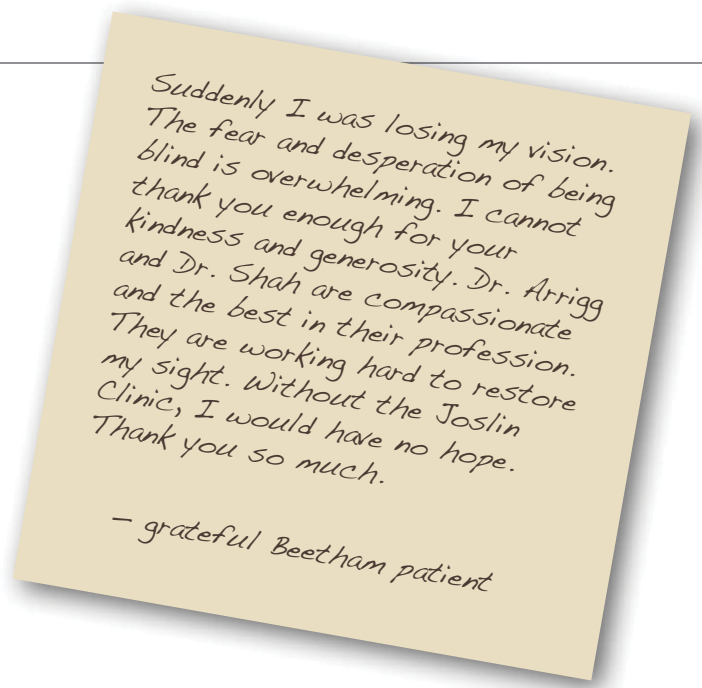

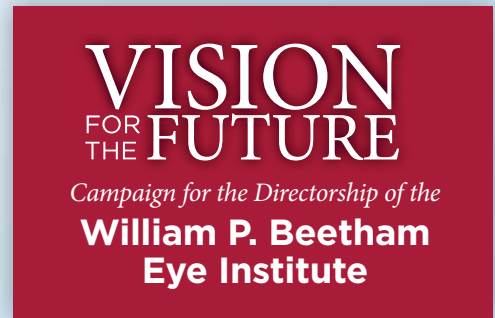

Long recognized for groundbreaking achievements in eye research and treatment, Joslin's Beetham Eye Institute (BEI) is embarking on a historic campaign to endow a directorship that will ensure its legacy in perpetuity. The new \$4 million Vision for the Future campaign will pave the way for unparalleled opportunities to advance uninterrupted through the continued recruitment of leading faculty from around the world.
