

## Pastoral Thoughts

Changing Times,

Dear Sisters and Brothers, we can finally see a glimpse of light during this time of darkness. We will be in a state of transition for some time and whatever is the new normal will take some time to evolve because there are so many unknowns related to this virus.

Gratefully, we can finally look forward to celebrating the mass finally the weekend of May 16th and 17th at our regular times, but there will be changes in how we initially return to celebrate. I will list a **few items that will be mandatory** and help make your experience much better.

1. **All individuals must wear a mask to enter the church – no exceptions,**
2. Children under the age of two (2) do not have to wear mask
3. No shaking of hands
4. **Everyone must practice safe distancing – keeping a 6-foot distance**
5. **Families may sit together** and do not have to be 6-foot space separation
6. **You may only sit in designated pews that are marked**
7. Once you are seated in your pew you may take off your mask, but must put it back anytime you leave your pew

### During the mass you will find a few adjustments as well:

1. There will be no hymnals in the pews
2. Holy Water fonts will remain empty
3. Mask are not required once in your pew
4. No wine will be distributed
5. When you come to communion you must wear your mask (instructions will be given at mass)
6. Please follow the tape on the floor on the direction to go to receive communion (instructions will be given at mass)
7. Communion will be distributed to the hand (instructions will be given at mass)
8. You will be given instructions on how to procession out / no stopping to talk inside the church

## Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combating sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or [crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org](mailto:crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org), if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
