I would like to thank all those who have pitched in to help with our weekend liturgies. As you know, Fr. Leonard has gone back to Kenya for the funeral of his father (Peter) and to be with his family for a few weeks. So, somethings were put together rather hastily to meet the absence of Father, but you all responded very well and for that I am grateful.

We were also blessed to have the replica of the Our Lady of Guadalupe painting here last weekend, and the parishioners of Sacred Heart – Our Lady of Guadalupe parishes thank those who purchased tickets for the drawing, as well as the generosity of an anonymous donor who purchased a ticket for myself. I was asked, why we were allowing another parish to come in with their raffle as a fund-raising event.

The answer is simple, we are all called by Christ to aid one another, and during this time of uncertainty, on what may or may not happen in the diocese, it is more important for parishes to work together for the welfare of the whole community of Christ.

This coming Tuesday, we will have our Town Hall meeting at 6:30 PM in the Church. We will be giving out information on the status of the parish, along with what has occurred in the diocese recently and what we need to do to put ourselves in the best position to remain a vibrant, stand alone parish. I promise to hold the meeting to 1-hour, because I know it is a burden for many to come out during the week. We are not looking to solve any problems Tuesday night, but to give you the information you need so that we can begin to have discussions on how we should proceed in the future.

We will also discuss the possibility of mass time changes that are a direct effect of our priest shortage. In the past we had a pool of well over 20 priest we could call on in the diocese to come and do mass for us, but that number has shrunk to less than 10 across the whole diocese.

Volunteerism by all is going to be more important than ever as we move forward.

I look forward to meeting with all of you to discuss our situation and get some positive feedback as we prepare our parish for the next generation.

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or [crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org](mailto:crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org), if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

Excerpt from *Saints for Our Times*

Inigo was born in 1491, the youngest of thirteen children in the ancestral castle of the Loyolas, a Basque family of minor nobility. (He would take the name Ignatius later in life, perhaps in imitation of the martyr Ignatius of Antioch.) Of his early life we have little detail beyond a few reminiscences taken down many years later. At around age fifteen, he took service as a page in the household of a relative who had a significant post in the kingdom of Castile. In his mid-twenties he entered military service under the Viceroy of Navarre. The military vocation came naturally to Ignatius; he came from a family of soldiers. Ignatius imbibed deeply of the spirit of his time and place, and set before his eyes the ideal of the accomplished man of the world: vain and dashing, concerned with military glory and the attentions of fashionable ladies. His brief comment in his *Autobiography* (in which he speaks of himself in the third person) notes simply that "he was a man given over to vanities of the world with a great and vain desire to win fame."
