## astoral Thoughts

### Are you Baptized into Christ death?

Our second reading today, from St. Paul to the Romans, gives us hope where most people would never look—death. For it is through Christ sacrifice that we are redeemed, and the church is born to nourish us forward.

It is a strange concept that most people in the time of Christ could not understand and even today we too can struggle with it. But when we accept Christ and His teachings that go beyond the law and all we are accustomed to, a clarity can overcome us. We understand that His teachings are direct and simple so there can be no misunderstanding. The only time arguments arise, is when individuals try to twist His teachings for their own gain, or they do not want to face the fact that they are not living as they should.

What can be simpler than to love your God and to love your neighbor as you love yourself. Once we are baptized and purge the sinfulness that can be so inviting, we can really begin to live the life we are called to.

As St. Paul says, “death no longer has power over him”, and if we accept Christ it will no longer have power over us as well. We will no longer be slaves to our sinful desires, but rather benefactors of our Lords loving grace. By no means does it mean it will be easy, but we will be given the graces to persevere in our Journey.

Our Lord Jesus Christ ask so little. Upon His ascension to be reunited with His Father, He gave us the Paraclete—The Holy Spirit, the Advocate to help guide us and nourish us in this lifetime, so that we too may join Him in Heaven and gather with our brothers and sister around His Heavenly throne.

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or [crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org](mailto:crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org), if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

I began to think of all I still had to look forward to when John and I boarded that ship and headed back home. We recently had found a fertility specialist with a new take on our case and a willingness to work within the limits of our Catholic faith, including our refusal to pursue IVF. And I had just started talking with a new friend whose successful domestic-adoption story allayed some of my fears about adoption's legal hassles and about a birth mother reclaiming a child years down the road. Although John and I still sensed God calling us to try to conceive, we did not want to delay parenthood much longer. So we had resolved to spend two more months in early 2009 trying for a biological child, then turn our attention to adoption.
