

P astor's Thoughts

Greetings

Today, we begin to wind down from all our 4th of July celebrations with family and friends. This is a holiday that we celebrate our national independence. We American's sometime lose sight of all the wonderful privileges and benefits we receive from being fortunate to be citizens of this great country. All one has to do is watch the news any night to be reminded of this fact. Freedom is a wonderful gift envied by many, but understanding true freedom takes a little wisdom and is achievable by all.

In our gospel today, Christ sends the seventy-two out to obtain this freedom and evangelize. Freedom is the choice to make decisions for yourself; and the seventy-two have made the decision to follow Christ. Leaving all their possessions behind that they have been accustomed to having and relied on and having taken that leap of faith that there is more to this life than material things. For they have begun to realize that as long as they were working and walking with the Lord, their needs would be met. If you would like to give a donation towards these items, there are envelopes at the entrances this weekend and will be in each of the pews next weekend, for you to use and place in the collection baskets during the offertory at Mass. They will be available in pew from now until August 31. There will be envelopes at the tables at the entrances to church until September 30.

Remember that last year we raise \$2,400.00. This was double the amount from our previous year! WOW!!! Way to go Our Lady of Sorrows and Our Lady of Hope!

These dollars allowed us to purchase many items such as, basic items that help touch the lives of every student at both Our Lady of Hope School (No affiliation with Our Lady of Hope Ordinariate community housed here) and Holy Cross School. We were able to provide cursive writing books, supplies for the art and music programs, and an item for the PE department. These supplies were greatly appreciated.



Saint Maria Goretti—Fourteen Flowers of Pardon

Watch—Documentaries—Modern-day Saints

This is the true story of a young virgin's ultimate act of love. On her deathbed, eleven year old Maria Goretti forgave Alessandro Serenelli, the man who mortally stabbed her because she resisted his attempted rape. Alessandro was sentenced to thirty years in prison for murdering Maria, and after eight years in jail, he had no remorse. But he eventually converted after Maria miraculously appeared to him in a dream.



Shot on location in Italy, this moving account takes you on a historic and poignant journey through the life, martyrdom, and canonization of the Roman Catholic Church's youngest saint, Maria Goretti. Maria's life and martyrdom in Italy's Pontine swamps at the beginning of this century comes to life through historic photographs, interviews with her mother, and never seen before film footage of the canonization ceremony.

This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind. It may contain violence indicative of the life and times of the saint or character portrayed. We would recommend Parental Guidance and that parents preview it before watching with children.

Run Time: 58 mins.
