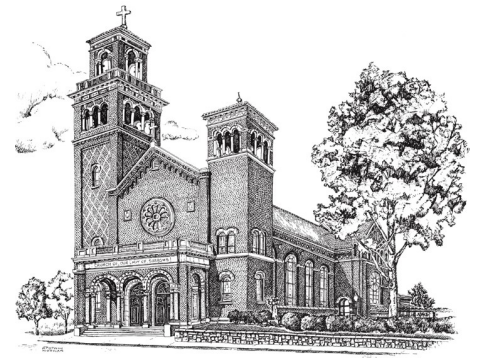

## Pastoral Thoughts

Today our scriptures can feel unrelated until we look a little closer at them. Then we will see the strands of relationships and faith weaved through all three in the lessons being taught.

In our first reading, those who have trust and Faith in God will be saved from the impending doom being brought on by the Babylonians; who only have faith in their weapons and give no credit for successes to God.

In our second reading we hear of the promises of life through Jesus Christ; for God grants this through a union with our Lord in response to our faith and love.

Both recall our faith, and the need to have a relationship with our Lord, and this is only expanded upon in our Gospel as Christ talks about the having true and honest faith in him and the Father— if even it is only the size of a mustard seed it will flourish and become huge.

With this type of faith anything is possible, but it requires a relationship as well. Which leads us too the final part of the Gospel which focuses on duty.

For when we profess our faith to God – that is only a starting point. We must be truthful in how we act in our lives, fulfilling our duty as Christians towards one another. Faith and works are essential to one another and with out both our declaration of faith to God can be a little hollow.

2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or [crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org](mailto:crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org), if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

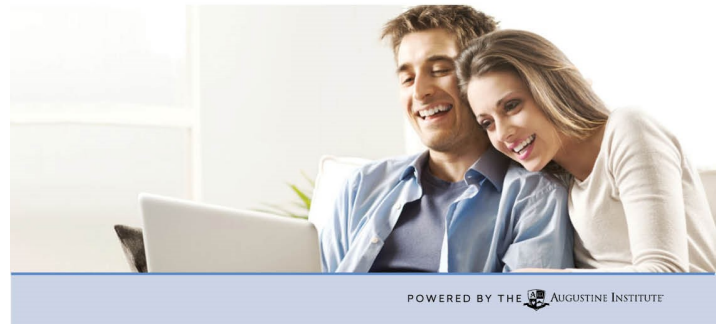
