Now that Summer has arrived many people will be traveling, and we will be having many visitors who are visiting our great city. Let us all make a conscience effort to greet those we don't know and allow them to feel the welcoming nature of our parish.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ - Corpus Christi (Body of Christ), a day to recall and reflect on the importance of the Eucharist to our lives.

A few years ago, Nikki and I were traveling and stopped in New Orleans for a few days. One morning as we were leaving the hotel, we stopped by the front desk to ask where we could get a list of parish mass times in the areas.

The clerk looked up at us and said you must be catholic. A little surprised by the question we said yes, how did you know? He said only the Catholics ever seem to worry about attending services when they are on vacation. I smiled and said – Yes, we do.

For we Catholics the Body and Blood of Christ is one of the most important things to us – it's essential to our being able to live out our faith. Each day at mass we celebrate with world-wide church and receive the Eucharist and nourishment we need to aid us through our trials and recognize those things that are truly important.

There are many symbols associated with this feast such as the chalice and host or grapes and wheat which are the most common. Traditionally this day was celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday (the 8th Thursday after Easter) but most diocese have now moved it to the following Sunday.

For we Catholics, it is a time of great reverence, personal growths and joy for Christ great gift. So, remember when you travel – you can ask for no better companion than Christ, so seek out those mass times to help make your trip complete.

Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, at 816.812.2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

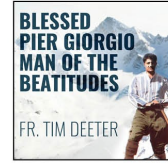
