Hallelujah, Trinity Sunday!

My dear Sister and Brothers, today we celebrate the Great Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. It is a feast upon which everything in Christianity is based upon. That the Trinity is the divine mystery of three persons in one – a fundamental dogma of our faith.

For in the name of the Trinity all Christians are baptized and come into the faith, a faith and understanding that is sometimes confusing for us, but one day when we reach heaven we will properly understand how it all works. We will then understand the role of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit more clearly and the mysteries will no longer confound us.

Feast of St. Anthony—June 13

Please plan on joining us on Saturday June 13th at 10 AM as we celebrate the Feast of St. Anthony of Padua.

Our Lady of Sorrows was staffed for nearly 100 years by the good Franciscans and they held St. Anthony in high esteem.

St. Anthony is beloved worldwide, and patron of lost items. Many of us have heard the short prayer:

“Tony, Tony,
look around,
Help me find,
What can't be found”.

This simple prayer has helped many people in distress find help.

During my trip to Rome last year, this prayer was invoked for one of the pilgrims on the trip. We had just left a ruins area and one of the ladies went into the restroom to wash her hands and went outside to shake them off because the towel dispenser had run out. While she shook her hands in the air her wedding ring slid off her finger into a bushy area bordering the sidewalk. She had no ideal where it went and called out for help. Once 4-5 of us gathered we said the prayer to St. Anthony because we knew without his help, we would never find her ring in the brush since we had less than 10 minutes before our bus had to leave.

Oh, what a blessing it was when one of our group found the ring. We took a moment to thank St. Anthony and continued on our way, and the lady was so relieved she would not have to tell her husband that she lost her wedding ring.

The power of prayer never ceases to amaze me, and St. Anthony is known to have helped so many believers around the world. So please plan to join us on June 13th for a wonderful liturgy and connecting us to our past here at Our Lady of Sorrows.

Excerpt from ROME SWEET HOME by Scott and Kimberly Hahn:

From Kimberly:

I wasn't exempt from wrestling with the truth just because Scott was a persuasive person. But I didn't want to hear it. It was too scary—I had too much to lose. I should have been at least curious to know why he thought Catholicism was so biblical, of all things, because Scripture was the basis of my convictions. But I was too threatened by it to want to ask.

I began to feel as if I were married to a man I didn't marry. I had married a reformed Presbyterian, not just a generic Christian. However, Scott reminded me that what drew me to him was that he was a Bible-believing Christian, which he still was. He begged me to come alongside him in his study, but I couldn't. I didn't want to.

Scott, after all, had been anti-Catholic—he had thought one could not be a thoughtful Christian and remain Roman Catholic. I, on the other hand, had had a more balanced approach—Catholics can be Christians, but there was no need and certainly no desire on my part to want to be Catholic. Perhaps all his study would help him be less judgmental toward Catholics and more like me. But no longer condemning them did not mean joining them!

One night, Scott told me he had begun praying the Rosary. I couldn't believe my ears! I didn't even know he owned one. This study and now practice of Catholicism were getting serious.
