Pastor's Ponderings

He is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed!!

I have to say that the Sacred Paschal Triduum is my favorite time of the liturgical year. I love all the services individually, but I particularly love the singular journey that we take, as followers of Jesus, during those days. As it says on the website of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, *The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.*

The summit of that summit, or the apex, is, of course Easter. Jesus does not remain in the tomb in history, nor does He in our liturgy. On Easter Sunday, we proclaim, "He is risen! He is risen, indeed!" All that he endured for us in his passion and death found its completion in the resurrection, for we, too, do not belong permanently in the grave.

Out of all the great quotes about Easter, my favorite comes from St. John Paul II. *Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song.* This was not a part of an Easter homily. He shared it at the end of Mass in Adelaide, Australia Sunday, on November 30, 1986.

Being the Easter people means that we no longer allow ourselves to be limited in our vision to only what is available and possible in this world. Embracing the resurrected Jesus, we realize that we eternal life begins now, not just after death. St. Paul reminds us of this in Romans 8:11 when he says, *If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you.*

While the hope of eternal life is our final joy, the reality that his resurrection power, through the Holy Spirit, does dwell in you, is our immediate joy. Throughout the Easter season, we will be reading how that applied to the early church, in our readings from the Book of Acts and begin to see how it works in us as well.

This weekend it all begins because He is risen! He is risen, indeed!

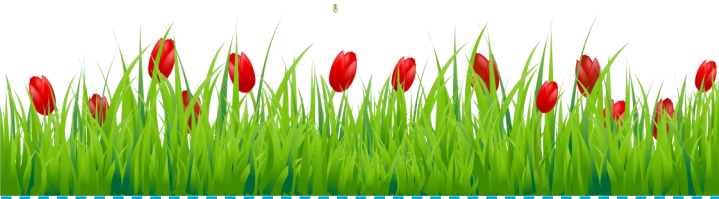

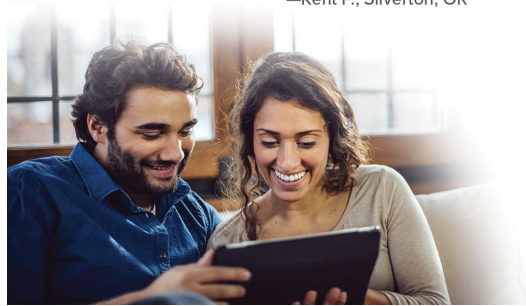

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Jenifer Valenti, at 816.812.2500 or JeniferValenti@att.net, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
