Today we are hearing a gospel made not only for Christ time but for our time more than ever. With all the unrest in our country over racial equality; we hear Christ talking to a woman who would have been considered an enemy of the Jewish people – for she was a Canaanite.

It appears as if Jesus is initially blowing off the woman who has approached him for help, but rather he is making a point to his disciples. It was rare for a man to speak to a woman especially a stranger who was not of his country.

Jesus referred to her as a dog, which would have been a normal slang for a pagan, but it is in her persistence that he is able to see that her faith is strong and legitimate. For she has not had the privilege of hear Jesus speak, but she knew from the stories she heard about him that he was a Holy man, even using the messianic term “Son of David”. And because of this, Christ granted her prayer and healed her daughter from the demon.

Christ is showing his disciples and everyone that all that believe in him, not just the Jewish population but all humanity are welcomed to the table and treated the same.

Today in much of our society we still have trouble with acceptance of those who look different than us or speak differently. Our nation has experienced a great outcry over the last few months – pleading for equality for all peoples.

Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combating sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

The Life & Justice Campaign

What is the Life & Justice Campaign?

The Life & Justice Campaign is a program co-sponsored by the Diocese of Kansas City—St. Joseph Human Rights and Respect Life Offices through which our faithful have the opportunity to support local organizations dedicated to defending the dignity of the person and the sanctity of human life.

How does the Life & Justice Campaign work?

- Donations may be made to the Life & Justice Campaign at any time. A special second collection is taken up in parishes throughout the diocese in the month of August.
- Applications for grants may also be submitted any time. To be considered for a grant in a given year, applications must be received no later than Dec. 31 of the previous year.
- All grant decisions are made locally in the month of March by the diocesan Life & Justice Campaign Committee.
- 100% of all donations received by the Life & Justice Campaign each calendar year are distributed locally.
- Only organizations that meet all of the published criteria are eligible to receive a grant.
- Every organization that meets all of the criteria receives a grant based on a weighted rating scale.
- Grant recipients are invited to an awards reception in the month of May where they have the option to discuss and to display information about their organization for the rest of the recipients.

Place your donation for the collection in the basket with your regular offering. Mark on an envelope that it is for "Life & Justice". The collection will be taken up this weekend, August 15 & 16.
