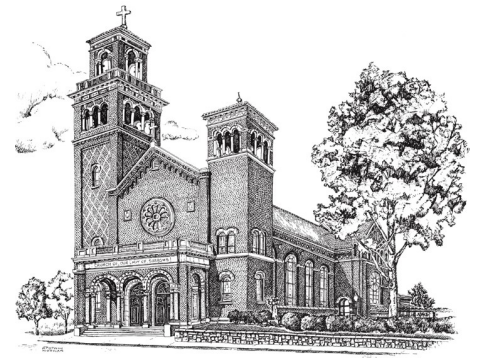

## **P**astoral Thoughts *Living a life with Christ*

The focus this weekend is on the Communion of Saints and Blessings, as we hear in our Gospel. With All Saints day falling on Sunday we celebrate those have passed and those who are still here among us who are less noticed and living a life of Christ.

The Church teaches that a saint is someone who has passed and exemplified their life in Christ and is acknowledge by the faithful.

We too are saints, part of the communion of saints that we profess every Sunday in the creed. For we share a spiritual solidarity with the souls in purgatory and the saints in heaven in a mystical body under Christ our head.

We are saints in transition, on a journey, that will conclude, we pray with an eternity with our loving Lord, for we have partaken from the fruits of redemption.

The Beatitudes in our gospel today give us a road map of how we should strive to live our lives. We are called to meek, we are called to be merciful, and peacekeepers, among other things in this litany of blessings listed in Mathew and Luke.

In short, we are called to live as Christ lived. You will notice that there is no call for accruing material things, status, and wealth. Rather the focus is how do we treat our fellow human beings, are we just with them or are we oppressive?

We are called to not desire or thirst for material things, but rather focus on those things that gain praise in heaven.

Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount very early in His ministry, not long after He had selected the twelve. Because, from the very beginning He wanted them to understand what the true gifts from heaven are. They were not going to become a band of privileged disciples who wore nice vestments and had plenty of gold and silver. No, rather, they would drape themselves in poverty in service of their brothers and sisters,
