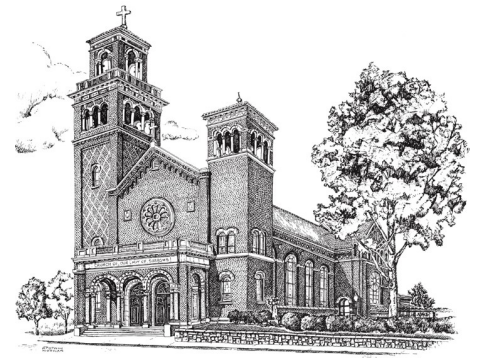

Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

Today we in our Gospel we hear Christ ask his disciples, "Who do the people say the Son of Man is?" The disciples reply that some say he is John the Baptist or Elijah. But Simon Peter replied, "you are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

For Peter through the grace of the Father was able to see Jesus for who he was, because his faith had grown immensely since he first call Simon and his brother Andrew, who formerly had followed John the Baptist.

Christ awards Simon Peter with the keys to heaven, giving him authority to build his church and have the ability to bind or loose things on earth that will be bound or loosen in heaven. He makes him head of a church that will never be overtaken by the demons of hell.

What a gift he bestowed on this humble fisherman, and also what a wonderful revelation that the church will never be overrun by satin, even though it will experience many trials, it gives comfort to us all.

We see Christ again rewarding someone who has tremendous faith. Last week we heard of the woman who was a Canaanite, considered an enemy of the Jewish people who had a never met Christ but only heard of his Holy deeds. After some exchange of dialogue Christ agrees to heal her daughter who has been infested with a demon. He notes her great faith and signals to his disciples that Gods grace is not confined to only the Jewish people, but open to all.

## Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or [crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org](mailto:crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org), if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
