

P astoral Thoughts

Our readings convey a message of Trust – Trust in the Lord and be ready at a moment's notice, not letting ourselves get bogged down with material things.

The Israelites in our first reading from Wisdom are preparing to leave Egypt and head to the promised land, for the night of Passover is approaching. They are to leave quickly at the appointed time, thus causing them to leave unessential things behind.

While in our second reading from Hebrews, Abraham is also getting ready to take a journey of faith to receive his inheritance. His destination is unknown and will lead him to another country. He will be tested and face many trials including being asked to sacrifice his son as a seal of his faith. Abraham meets all these challenges and is awarded with news that his descendants will be as bountiful as the stars in the heavens.

And in our Gospel from Luke we hear Christ preparing his disciples for their journey as well. They are to take little and rely on the Father to meet their needs, and in return they will be rewarded with a treasure that will never perish and it will rest in their hearts.

We too must be prepared for our travels as well, even if the length of our journey today is only to church for the Eucharist; preparation is still essential.

Our faith and our church are always in motion, for we are a missionary people asked to carry the good news to whoever we may meet. Likewise, we are also a pilgrim people continuously on a journey of faith and discovery. Seeking insight not only of our faith, but also to define who we are and our role in this master plan; and many times, we already know the answer and are hoping he will change it. Instead we should pray on how to do what is asked of us and accept this Grace from the Father like Abraham who was greatly rewarded.

Remember that last year we raise \$2,875.58. This was \$475.00 more than our previous year! WOW!!! Way to go Our Lady of Sorrows faithful parishioners and visitors!

These dollars allowed us to purchase many items such as, basic items that help touch the lives of every student at both Our Lady of Hope School (No affiliation with Our Lady of Hope Ordinariate community) and Holy Cross School. These schools are the 2 Urban Core Schools and part of the Bright Futures Fund recipients. From crayons and paper to hand sanitizer and Kleenex. We were able to provide cursive writing books, supplies for the art and music programs, and an item for the PE department. These supplies were greatly appreciated.

Whatever you can give will be greatly appreciated and put to good use in the purchase of school supplies for the children of our Bright Futures schools. I will be keeping you up to date on the amount raised each week. Let's see if we can top our number from last year!

Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.






The Bible and the Virgin Mary Journey through Scripture Under Study—Bible Studies—Discover the Catholic Faith
