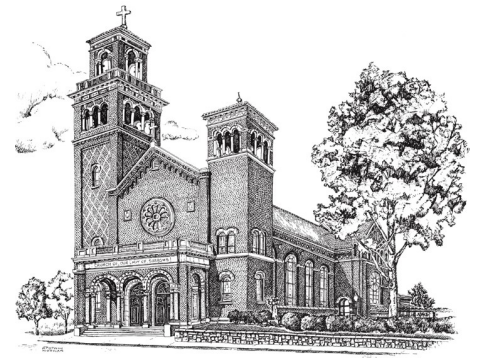

Holy Week

Happy Palm/Passion Sunday! As we head into Holy Week, I thought I would take the time to get us up to speed in a number of areas and let you all know of some wonderful things taking place in our parish.

On Holy Thursday (also called Maunday Thursday), our Mass will begin at 4:30pm. There will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament after both Masses from the Sacred Heart Altar.

The Passion of the Cross on Good Friday will take place at Noon with Veneration of the Cross taking place until 3:00pm when we will have Stations of the Cross.

Our Easter Vigil will be a combined service with Our Lady of Sorrows and Our Lady of Hope using the Ordinarate Form. This will begin at 8pm.

Our Easter Sunday Masses are at their normal times.

Noah's Bandage Project

During Lent we began collecting "cool" bandages for Noah's Bandage Project, which supplies super hero and other fun bandages to the patients at Children's Medical Center and other children's hospitals in other regions. I hope most of you have had a chance to participate by bringing boxes of bandages to place on the table in our narthex or giving a cash donation.

We'll be continuing our drive through Eastertide.

Noah's Bandage Project – How It Started

Noah's Bandage Project has two goals – 1) to help provide cool and fun bandages to kids that need them, and 2) to help raise funds for pediatric cancer research

Noah, my grandson, was diagnosed with cancer on Good Friday in 2014. As a cancer patient, Noah Wilson, then age 6, quickly discovered that a bandage is a pretty significant thing. The hospital he was at did not have the cool, fun ones.... just the boring brown ones. So, in typical Noah fashion, he figured out a really neat and simple way of helping his fellow patients. Collecting cool, fun bandages!!

He thought, 'Why don't we ask if people would help me collect the fun bandages so that hospitals could have more cool and fun ones for more kids?' Simple enough, right!? So, driven by his new task, Noah created his first sign, got his first tub for collecting bandages, and got to work. Little did he know how big this idea would become.

Pastor's Ponderings Continued

Through Noah's efforts, his bandage project has helped hospital administrators see the need and importance of increasing their supply of these cool and fun bandages for kids. He's already helped to provide thousands of bandages to hospitals that were in short supply. These bandages have also been given to families to take home, free of charge! He also realized that these bandages could go to places other than hospitals, as well, and has helped provide bandages to many organizations that support kids. With numerous TV, newspaper, magazine, and online interviews and mentions of Noah's Bandage Project, his simple, yet pure hearted message of wanting to help kids like him have a little more fun in their lives has reached farther than any initially thought was possible. Noah also learned that when it comes to funding cancer research for kids, there is very little support. In fact, only 4% of our national cancer research budget goes to kids... 4%!!

After eight months of treatment, Noah was declared cancer-free and, subsequently, finished his treatments in May 2015. Unfortunately, an aggressive secondary cancer, AML Leukemia, contracted due to the chemotherapy treatments, was discovered on June 27. On June 30, 2015 Noah passed away.

Noah's Bandage Project continued on, however, both in collecting bandages and raising money for pediatric cancer research. NBP is currently in the midst of fulfilling a \$1 million gift to Children's Mercy Hospital for the new pediatric cancer research center.

Through your generous contributions, Noah's Bandage Project works to provide HOPE to kids fighting cancer by funding targeted pediatric cancer research and spreading awareness of this horrible disease. Noah's vision was to make the lives of kids like him better as they endure the trials and pains associated with the normal course of treatments. We will never stop fighting until there is no more childhood cancer.

Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combating sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Jenifer Valenti, at 816.812.2500 or JeniferValenti@att.net, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

We are pleased to announce Our Lady of Sorrows will offer Stations of the Cross each Friday starting at 7:00pm. Good Friday, Stations will start at 3:00pm.



Lenten Regulations

These are our Lenten regulations: Ash Wednesday (March 6, 2019) and Good Friday (April 19, 2019) are days of fast and abstinence. Fasting means that we limit ourselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day. (It means, 'no snacking between meals') Abstinence means that we do not eat meat on these days.

Catholics between the ages of 18 & 59 are obliged to fast. Catholics over the age of 14 are obliged to refrain from meat.

We Catholics are obligated to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays during Lent. We are encouraged to fast on Fridays during Lent, as well as other days during Lent.

Although the faithful enjoy freedom in conscience to excuse themselves for a just cause from these mitigated laws of fast and abstinence, the obligation to do penance is a serious one and no Catholic should lightly excuse himself/herself from this obligation in the Lenten season.

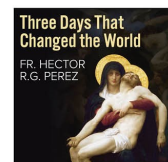
