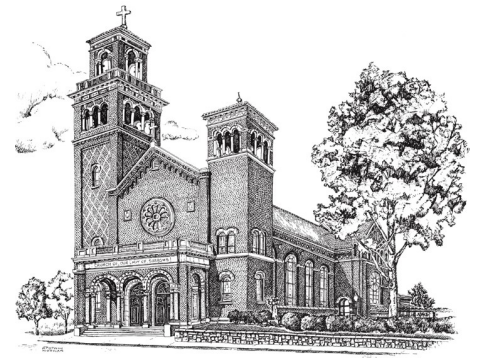

### Greetings to all

Hello, my brothers and sisters, I hope you are well and remain positive during this difficult time. We continue to all adjust to this changing time, and with the approaching flu season it brings about a lot of uncertainty.

Bishop Johnston has continued to extend dispensation to anyone who does not feel comfortable coming back to mass at this time which is a welcomed relief to many. I would encourage you if you are not attending mass yet to call the office and get on the prayer list - so we can pray for all of you that are awaiting a safe return. As a parish family, it is important that we do not forget anyone and keep all our sisters and brothers in our prayers.

The diocese has approved a few changes beginning immediately affecting the mass. We will now be able to take up the collection during the mass as we did prior, plus we can now have bulletins for distribution at the conclusion of the mass from the ushers.

These may seem like small changes, but they are important small steps as we attempt to return to worshiping as we did prior to the Covid outbreak. ## Office of Child & Youth Protection—Sexual Abuse

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combating sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1.800.392.3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Diocesan Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816.812.2500, or [crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org](mailto:crayon@ombudsmankcsj.org), if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

## Into the Light Project

Habitat for Humanity of Kansas City and Lykins Neighborhood Association have been part of an effort to clean up the Lykins neighborhood by redesigning the park and adding a lot of new housing to the neighborhood, which has been a site for human trafficking for some time. The art project will be the first ever memorial to victims and survivors of human trafficking and will be the center piece of a transformation of the park. In addition, Habitat KC will be collaborating with other non-profits and developers to create 75 new homes in the neighborhood. The city has committed to a number of infrastructure and park improvements which will change the neighborhood dramatically. More information of the groundbreaking coming.
