

ARROWHEAD PUZZLE

LEVEL : EASY

To complete this simple block, you will need to choose three colours for your patch. The strips will be cut into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " widths.

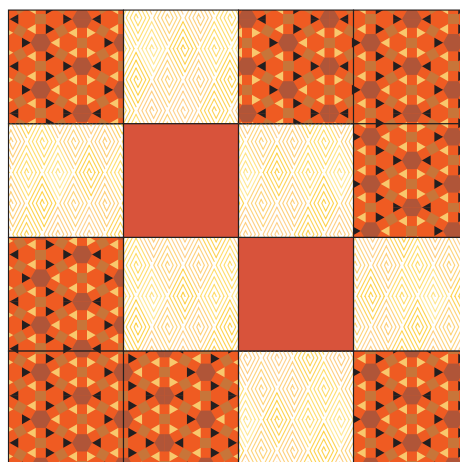
The required strips lengths to complete one patch are as follows:

Colour 1 - one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21" strip

Colour 2 - one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7" strip

Colour 3 - one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28" strip

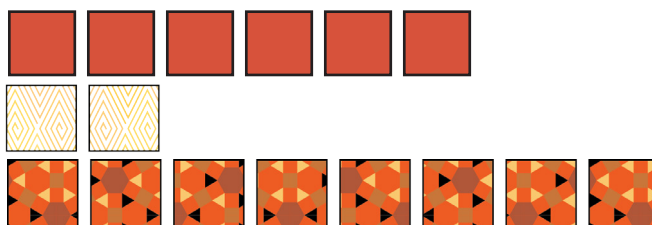
This will make one block 12" block.



METHOD

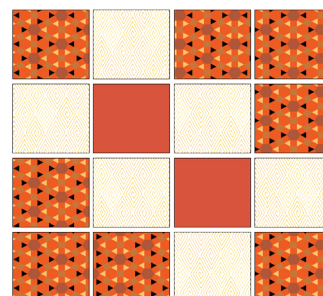
1. Cut your following strips as follows:

- Colour 1 strip into 6 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- Colour 2 strip into 2 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- Colour 3 strip into 8 x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

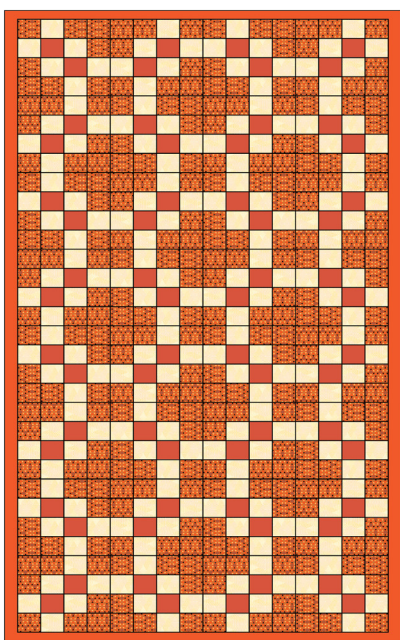


2. Using the cut squares, arrange them into the following pattern.

Starting with the rows, using the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance, sew each of squares, remembering to put right sides together. When pressing the seams, ensure you alternate the direction. Complete all four of the rows. Finally, bring all the four rows together by sewing along the length, again allowing for a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. When all four rows are attached you have your finished block.



Replicate the patch 20 times and you will produce enough blocks to make the quilt top below!



← This traditional block can produce stunning patterns with the effective use of colour and patterned material.

When piecing the blocks together in a row, the second, third and fourth blocks are rotated at 90° to the block on their left.

Piecing together, four blocks in width with eight blocks in depth will produce a quilt top that is approximately 48" wide x 96" in length.

A simple border to frame the quilt top sets off the design.
