Protest Movement	Objectives	Leaders	Sample Results
Civil Rights/Black Lives Matter (late 20 th /early 21 st c.)	Voting rights, ending segregation in schools and communities	Martin Luther King, Jr., Ella Baker, Julian Bond, Cesar Chavez, John Lewis, Rosa Parks, Malcolm X	Brown v. Board of Education – school desegregation; Civil Rights Act of 1964; Voting Rights Act of 1965
Women’s rights (late 20 th c)			Roe v. Wade (legal abortion); Title IX (school equality); women in the military; equal pay
Tea Party (early 21 st c.)			Restriction of abortion availability; spending limits; welfare reform; blocks to gun control

Gay rights			Gays in the military; workplace equality, <i>Obergefell v. Hodges</i> (same sex marriage)
Environmental protection			Earth Day; carbon and pollution controls; Endangered Species Act; international agreements.
Pacifism/Anti-War Movement			Ending of Vietnam War; withdrawals from Iraq and Afghanistan
