

ROMANS

Romans 2:12

All those who have sinned outside the law will also die outside the Law and all those who have sinned under the Law will be judged by the Law.

Romans 3:9-11

We have...charged that all, both Jews and Greeks, are under the power of sin. As it is written: None is righteous, no not one; no one understands, no one seeks for God. All have turned aside, together they have become worthless, *no one* does good, not even one.

Romans 3:20

For by the [good] works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight.

The Gospel is the Good News that God has made a way for all people to be declared right with himself through faith in Jesus.

"The chief point and very central place in the epistle, and of the whole Bible."

This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference [between Jew and Gentile], for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified by his grace as a gift through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.

1. The words "righteous" and "justify" are essentially the same word.

Both come from the Greek root word, dikaios.

2. Dikaios means "rightness" or "right standing" when measured against the law.

3. Verse 23 says that we are "justified by his *grace* as a *gift*".

"Grace is God loving, God stooping, God coming to the rescue, God giving himself generously in and through Jesus Christ."

4. God freely gives us his righteousness because of the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.

Romans 3:25

[God] put forward [Messiah Jesus]

as a propitiation

(a sacrifice of atonement)

by his blood, to be received by faith.

Romans 3:26

This was to show God's righteousness because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he [might be shown to be] just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

Romans 3:26 God did this to show his righteousness because in his divine forbearance (his patient mercy) he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be (shown to be) just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

For God to forgive sin apart from his justice would be for God to say that moral evil doesn't matter.

Romans 3:26

... to show himself to be both just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

What God Says In my justice, it was necessary that somebody had to pay.

What God Says In my mercy, let sin go unpunished for a while.

What God Says In my grace, I paid the price myself so you wouldn't have to.

Because of Jesus, God is able to justly justify the unjust.


