

The law exposes sin in me and it stimulates sin in me.

BASIC CHRISTIAN ANATOMY

I joyfully concur with the law of God in the inner man, but I see a different law in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind, and making me a prisoner of the law of sin which is in my members. (7:22,23)

FLESH

Unredeemed mortality, still attracted and subject to sin desires (v. 14)
Energized by Inborn and Ingrained Self-protecting and Self-enhancing Patterns of Thinking and Behaving

INNER MAN

Redeemed "New Man"
Attracted to God,
Energized by the Holy Spirit,
The Immaterial, Immortal
"Real" You

No longer am *I* the one doing it, but sin which dwells in *me*. (7:17, 20)

... that is, in my flesh (7:18).

He sees himself as a two-part person living under two conflicting laws.

Galatians 5

17 For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not able to do whatever you want.

Galatians 5

18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under law.

Romans 7

6 We are released from the law, having died to that which held us prisoner, so that we serve not under the old written code but in the new life of the Spirit.

If you try to deal with your struggle with sin by trying harder to obey more rules, you will not weaken the pull of sin in your flesh, you will only strengthen it, and you will make yourself miserable in the process.

Just as the law cannot save us from the penalty of our sins, neither can it save us from the power of sin.

Romans 7 is a common experience of all believers but it is not a description of the normal Christian life.

Trying harder to obey more rules only makes our struggle worse.

The problem is sin in me and the answer is Jesus living in me. Thanks be to God, Jesus has set me free from the power of sin.

The starting point for living in the "new way of the Spirit" begins with understanding that Jesus lives in you so he can live his life through you.

You live the Christian life, the same way you entered the Christian life.

I have been crucified with Christ so it's no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me and the life I now live in this mortal body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

Thanks be to God! Sin has no power over me. Jesus you have set me free, today, live your life through me.
