

SERMON TITLE: Remember-Repent-Replace DATE: March 19, 2023

SCRIPTURE: 1 Samuel 12 PASTOR: Jason Malone

SERIES SUMMARY

The Bible is the story of God as King and becoming King in Jesus. And we are his image bearers, created for royal reflection. But we don't live in a monarchy, so "kingship" and "royalty" can feel like foreign ideas to us. Yet, we're still called to recognize and submit to God as King. And in the Old Testament, it was God's desire for a king to reign over his people as a reminder of these things. So, what do the kings of old teach us about ourselves, our need, our calling, and our God? How can the lives and reigns of Saul, David, and Solomon be instructive to us as God's people today? How should royalty shape identity? And most importantly, how do all of these things make us look to Jesus as the King of kings?

SERMON SUMMARY

1 Samuel 12 is a testimony to Samuel's leadership. He calls Israel to remember how merciful God is, repent of their sins, and replace their idols with obedience and reverence to the one true King.

Questions to Identify Idols

- What do I tend to worry about most?
- What, if I lost it, would cause me to feel despair?
- What do I use to comfort myself when things go wrong or get difficult and/or stressful?
- What do I do to cope? What are my release valves when the pressures of life grow? What do I do to feel better?
- What preoccupies me? What do I daydream about?
- What makes me feel the most self-worth? Of what am I the proudest? For what do I want to be known?
- Who is the hero of most of my stories?
- Early on in meeting someone new, what do I want to ensure other people know about me?
- What do you write or post about the most on social networks?
- What prayer, unanswered, would make me seriously question the goodness of God?
- What prayer, answered, would make me love God more or believe He loves me more than He does now?

- What would it practically look like for you to REMEMBER-REPENT-REPLACE in this moment?
