Lesson 2: Rockin' Heart With Soul

Treble: C' D' E' F' G' A' B, C" D" E" F" Bass: G, C D F G A Standards: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 9

Lesson and Performance

- In 4/4, discuss how many pairs of eighths or eighth note triplets would fit in a measure. On the board, make separate lines of eight single eighth notes, four pairs of eighth notes, and four eighth note triplets. Clap or play tubes after each line.
- 2. The chord progression in this piece is similiar to the pattern used by Hoagy Carmichael in his famous song "Heart and Soul." It is a perennial favorite at the piano, often learned by rote. Ask how many students have heard it or know how to play it, and perhaps schedule some performances.
- 3. Notice where the rhythm and chords change in this piece. Discuss whether the form is AB or ABA.
- 4. See the Hoagy Carmichael bio on page 10.
- 5. Optional: Play this chord progression with other melodies, such as "Ode to Joy" or "First Noel."

Activity: Three's a Crowd

Materials: FACE tubes, several large numbers: 2, 3, 4

- 1. Have two students come to the front. Give each one a big number 4, have them face the class and hold up the numbers to make a 4/4 time signature.
- 2. Have eight students come to the front of the room. They each make a crook with their left arm to look like the flag on an eighth note. Each eighth note gets half a beat. Have the rest of the class play the eighth note rhythm.
- 3. Have each two eighth notes join arms straight across at the shoulder to form eighth note pairs. Each group gets one beat. Play.
- 4. Give four people a number 3. Add one of them to the middle of each pair. The middle person holds the three over their head and the other two put a hand on that person's shoulder to form a triplet. Play.
- 5. Change the time signature and players and repeat. Always make single eighths, pairs and triplets in that order.
