Performance Notes

Salvation is Created was written by Pavel Tschesnokoff (1877-1944), a Russian composer for the Orthodox Church. This piece was the last religious piece he wrote before the Communist take over of Russia, culminating in the new government, the former USSR. Under Communist rule, religious music was not allowed; however, after the fall of Communism, Salvation is Created was the piece performed first in the Russian Orthodox Church. Although Tschesnokoff never heard his piece performed live, his children did.

Originally composed for five-part a cappella choir, this arrangement makes a timeless classic accessible to treble voices. The original flavor and harmonies are left intact and the original key of D Major is also maintained. Naturally, some "re-positioning" of voices was necessary in order to accommodate SSA voices. The suggested slow, reverent tempo presents challenges regarding breathing. In mm. 1- 21, strive to breathe only at punctuation marks (comma) and rests. When singing the "Alleluias," group them in twos and breathe after each grouping.

I hope that you enjoy singing this beautiful piece.
