




His original arrangement of *Loch Lomond* was written for *musica intima*, and may be heard on their CD entitled, "clear".

This song is most likely a tale about two of Bonnie Prince Charlie's men, captured and left behind in Carlisle after the failed rising of 1745. One is to be executed, while the other is set free. According to Celtic tradition, the condemned man's spirit would return to his homeland via the "low road": His spirit will reach Scotland before his comrade gets home, but he will never meet his true love again.
