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To The Director

Thomas Morley is the most well-known composer of secular music during the Renaissance era, and the madrigal *Now Is The Month Of Maying* is his most popular. A madrigal is a type of secular vocal music, written during the Renaissance and early Baroque eras. This madrigal is in 4-part harmony, and contains 2 sections which repeat with the verses of text (A and B themes).

This accessible arrangement is in G major, and contains the typical C# and F naturals which define the music of the Renaissance. It uses a four measure introduction in the low strings to set up the first statement of the A theme (which occurs later in the upper strings to set up another statement of the A theme).

When rehearsing this piece, have the group practice common passages together to solve rhythm, pitch and bowing issues. Once everyone is familiar with the two main themes, it will be easier to teach the accompanying parts with their rhythmic contrasts and imitative character.
