Dr. Gilroy is active as a guest conductor and clinician throughout the United States. Most notably, he has served as guest conductor for the Oregon All-State JHS Honor Band and the California All-State High School Symphonic Band. He has published numerous compositions and arrangements for concert band, percussion ensemble and marching band.

### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

Style: This is a rhythmic, separated style.

- 1. It is important to observe all accents.
- 2. There needs to be a strong "sense of pulse", so the performance sounds innately rhythmic. Generally, the strongest beat in each measure will be the first beat, and the third beat is the next strongest beat. Beats 2 and 4 are not as strong.

## STYLE INDICATORS

accent (>) – emphasis on a note or chord. Accented notes are separated notes. staccato  $(\cdot)$  – detatched, separated and light.

## **TEMPO INDICATORS**

Moderato – Play at a moderate tempo.

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
