PROGRAM & REHEARSAL NOTES

Imagine yourself sitting in a bustling urban café, lost in your own thoughts as you stare out the window at the life busily moving by. You find yourself watching the same scene—more or less—being played over and over again. So you turn and look in another direction. Eventually, you realize you're in a coffee shop, snap out of your daze, and wonder what you had just seen.

So unfolds *City in the Window*, a programmatic work for large jazz ensemble.

The piano plays the main theme in the first three measures. The following 150 measures are variations, abstractions, and general riffs on this theme. Play with accuracy, shape, and rhythmic precision.

Encourage the rhythm section and soloists to play as if they're in a quartet, at least until the background figures come in. Get creative! In fact, on UNI's original recording, the drummer drops out at the beginning of the soprano solo. Even though I hadn't considered that possibility, it's very effective!

The very end should be distant and dream-like.

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ABOUT THE COMPOSER

Rick Hirsch was born and raised in Newark, DE (August, 10 1970) and has music degrees from UMass-Amherst (BA, *Summa Cum Laude*) and Northern Illinois University (MM). His most influential teachers were Lloyd Ross, Bill Byerly, Lynn Klock, Yusef Lateef, Jeff Holmes, Ron Modell, Steve Duke, Ronald Carter, Boysie Lowery and Dave Liebman.

Hirsch received his post-graduate street creds while working as personal music copyist for Bob Mintzer, Toshiko Akiyoshi, and Yusef Lateef.

Hirsch's tangled musical DNA includes threads of Mingus, Miles, and Brubeck; Zeppelin, the Beatles, and Bluegrass; Spike Jones, Mickey Katz, and Weird Al; and liturgical Jewish Music, Tito Puente, and Celtic Music. In spite of (or because of) this, his compositions have been commissioned, performed, and recorded by the Univ. of Northern Iowa Jazz Band, Univ. of Kentucky Wind Ensemble, Continental Trombone Quartet, Osland Saxophone Quartet, Capitol Quartet, Penn State Blue Band, trumpeter Eddie Henderson, saxophonist Chris Vadala, Blue Note vocalist Jackie Allen, and numerous school jazz ensembles throughout Pennsylvania
