This galactic journey is an exciting space-themed adventure piece that will captivate your developing orchestras and have them feeling and playing confidently in $\frac{6}{8}$ time. With an epic and memorable main theme, this fun programmatic piece of music will transport your students into a world of simple and compound meters as they dig into their strings.

PROGRAM NOTES

Get ready to take off with this original piece by Anthony Granata. *Into the Stars: A Galactic Journey* is an exciting space-themed adventure. If you close your eyes, you will think you are traveling at light speed through space. A rhythmically intense introduction depicting the excitement of take-off leads to the memorable main theme. This programmatic work helps envision the beauty and mystery of space.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

To achieve mastery of the various rhythmic motifs used throughout, identify, isolate, and practice each one repeatedly to gain confidence and fluency.

At measure 31, be sure the orchestra plays in balance, so the cellos are heard. The melody then passes over to the violas at measure 39.

Be sure to have students observe the dramatic crescendos and diminuendos that occur during transitions (mm. 27–30, 43–47, 60–64).

At measure 64, help the violas perform these notes as double stops successfully by reminding them that the upper note is always an open string A. They can optionally divide this, if necessary.

NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

In orchestral music, there are many editorial markings that are open for interpretation. In an effort to maintain consistency and clarity you may find some of these markings in this piece. In general, markings for fingerings, bowing patterns, and other items will only be marked with their initial appearance.
