PROGRAM NOTES

Grand Pursuit is a contemporary work for young string orchestra by composer and educator Michael Kamuf. Written with the composer's students in mind, the dotted-quarter/eighth-note pattern is reinforced throughout the piece combined with contrasting melodies, bold harmonies, and a fun development section.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

The introduction should be played slowly and with attention to the accents. The tempo picks up at measure 5, where the entire ensemble except violin 1 switch to pizzicato. All members of the ensemble should subdivide the pulse so the tempo locks in. The A theme is presented by violin 1 in measure 7 and stated again at measure 15, with harmony in violin 2 and bowed accompaniment. The B theme is stated first by the cellos and basses at measure 23 with violin 2 and viola taking over at measure 31. Measure 39 begins a short but aggressive development section that should focus on uniform articulation throughout the ensemble. The B theme returns at measure 47, then there's a final statement of the A theme at measure 55. Throughout the piece, proper balance and dynamics within the ensemble will allow the melodic material to be heard.

I hope you and your students enjoy studying and performing Grand Pursuit.
