## PROGRAM NOTES

This lyrical piece has a warm and lovely chord progression that brings delicate emotion to the incredibly beautiful melody line. Your string orchestras will perform expressively as they play from the heart.

## NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

There are many non-harmonic tones that occur through the harmonic progression of *Orchids*. These appoggiaturas are very important to help convey the dramatic nature of the piece.

In the middle section, starting at measure 27, the music turns to another world. Here, the score is marked animato, the music should move forward. Somewhat darker harmonies continue agitatedly, but the music grows and leads to the climax at the measure 37. When the theme comes back, a gentle feeling of relief is present to the end.

This piece was written in memory of Mr. Atsutada Otaka, a well-known Japanese composer. He was my composition teacher and mentor. His hobby was to grow orchids in the plastic greenhouse in his backyard.
