## PROGRAM NOTES

*Tango Traicionera*, by Kirt Mosier, translated to English means “treacherous tango.” The tango is a Latin dance that first developed in the poor neighborhoods of Buenos Aires, Argentina, during the mid-19th century. The word “tango” literally means, “A Dance Party.” Imagine a gathering of bohemian nomads and workers having a dance party in the streets. There is a natural tension in this tango which mirrors this nighttime atmosphere. When I thought about the origins of this very descriptive dance form, I pictured that there could be danger and intrigue involved when a tango was played, and thus the idea of *Tango Traicionera* was born!

This tango utilizes all sections of the orchestra and employs slides and shifts between notes of the melodic figures in order to add intrigue to the sound. A lively middle section of the piece builds to a key change that returns the original tango in all its glory. The piece culminates with tense chords leading to an exciting finish.

## Note from the Editor

In orchestral music, there are many editorial markings that are open for interpretation. In an effort to maintain consistency and clarity you may find some of these markings in this piece. In general, markings for fingerings, bowing patterns, and other items will only be marked with their initial appearance.
