Songs of the British Isles combines the old Irish air "Down by the Salley Gardens" and the traditional Scottish folk song "I Know Where I'm Going."

"Down by the Salley Gardens" is a poem by William Butler Yeats published in *The Wanderings of Oisin and Other Poems* in 1889. A "salley" is a willow tree, and a "weir" is a low dam head. Commonly, water flows freely over the top of the weir crest before cascading down to a lower level.

"I Know Where I'm Going" is about a wealthy, love-struck young woman pining for her "bonnie," i.e., attractive lover Johnny, who some say has a bad reputation.
