Program Notes

A catchy tune in a spirited march with a unique and unusual form: there's not much more to ask for. The composer has provided the "more," however, for every section makes a significant contribution to the performance. The A-B-C-A form serves the tune well before closing with a rousing, but brief, coda.

Performance Suggestions

The tempo of 112 beat per minute is that of a slow street march. This makes performance of the dotted eighth – sixteenth note rhythm of extreme importance. Be certain there is a four-note subdivision underlying this pattern. Balance from one section to another is critical in measures 47 - 55 as melodic material is passed around the ensemble. All parts should be of equal volume. Measure 70 must also attend to balance issues. This time, the melody and countermelody should be treated as equal partners. The sixteenth note patterns at measure 84 should not be allowed to slow the tempo. It is often helpful to practice the pattern without slurs until the fingerings are performed evenly. The slurs can then be added again for accurate performance.
