Pride and Tradition

The Burlington Teen Tour Band, described as Canada's Musical Ambassadors, is a marching band which has performed all over the world, including many countries in Europe, Japan, the United States and across Canada. In 2022, the band celebrated its 75th anniversary and this piece was composed to celebrate the benchmark achievement.

After an intense build up, the first melodic material is introduced at measure 33, with a counter melody performed by the trombone at measure 41. It is this counter melody that is used throughout the work to tie the sections together and could be considered the most important material, so it should be brought out when it is first introduced.

In the lyrical section, the piece will slowly build as melodic material is moved throughout the various sections of the ensemble. After a short duet, the piece moves back into the introductory build up, utilizing fragments of melodic material from the main section. The piece is brought back down again at measure 108 to reintroduce the melodic material from measure 33 in a trombone solo, before its final push to the end of the piece.

Ryan Meeboer is a music educator, who obtained his degree through the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto. As a composer, he has written and arranged many pieces for concert band, jazz band, and small ensembles. His young band piece, *Last Voyage of the Queen Anne's Revenge*, has been well received by performers, educators, and audiences, and his pieces are starting to be found on festival and contest lists. As a performer, he has had experience in several groups, including concert and stage bands, chamber choir, vocal jazz ensemble, acoustic duets, and the Hamilton based swing group, "The Main Swing Connection".

Ryan began studying music at the age of seven through private guitar lessons. During his years in elementary and secondary school, he gained experience in several families of instruments. Focusing on music education and theory (including composition and orchestration), he attended McMaster University to achieve his honours degree in music. Ryan is currently a teacher for the Halton District School Board in Ontario, where he continues to compose and arrange.
